Article 1 Educational and Research Purpose

- 1. The purpose of the Faculty of Engineering is to develop leading human resources who attain a broad education, internationality and systematic knowledge of technology and are capable of contributing to the sustainment and development of mankind by using engineering methods for research, development, design, production, planning, management, policy proposal and other matters.
- 2. The purpose of developing human resources and other educational and research purposes for each department shall be prescribed separately.

Article 1-2 Departments

1. The following 16 departments and 25 course programs are established in the Faculty:

2. Notwithstanding the preceding paragraph, the specific department may be treated as a group as listed in Appended Table 1, if necessary.

Article 2 Study

Persons who wish to enter the Faculty must complete the designated courses at the College of Arts and Sciences of the University of Tokyo and pass the examinations therefor.

Article 3

Holidays shall be as prescribed in Article 5 (excluding the holiday prescribed in item (4)) of the University of Tokyo General Rules on Faculties (hereinafter referred to as the "General Rules on Faculties"). However, the summer holidays prescribed in item (5) commence on

August 1 and end on September 30.

Article 4

The courses and the number of credits thereof shall be as prescribed in Appended Table 2.

Article 5

Class hours shall be announced in advance in accordance upon discussion by the faculty council.

Article 6

- 1. Students shall take courses in the method prescribed in the course allocation sheet prescribed in Appended Table 2 of the department in which they are enrolled. However, students may take courses other than those prescribed in the course allocation sheet of the department in which they are enrolled as elective courses.
- 2. Students who are enrolled in a specific department or course program have a priority to take courses such as drawing, exercise and practical training, etc. held by that department or course program.
- 3. Students who intend to take courses of another faculty must obtain approval from the dean of the department and obtain permission from the dean of the Faculty and the deans of the relevant faculties.

Article 7

Students must apply for courses they intend to take at the designated office during the designated period in advance.

Article 8

Each department may determine the sequence of courses listed in Appended Table 2 and prescribed in Article 4 to be taken by students, and prescribe that only after taking specific courses and passing the examinations thereof, students may take other specific courses.

Article 9 Examinations

Pursuant to the provisions of Articles 26 and 27 of the General Rules on Faculties, students must complete the courses prescribed in Appended Table 2 and pass specialized course examinations and thesis examinations to graduate from the Faculty and obtain a Bachelor's degree (Bachelor of Engineering).

Article 10

- 1. Examinations shall be in writing. However, with regard to the courses including aspects such as experiments, drawings, exercises and practical training, etc., written examinations will not be given and regular results may be graded.
- 2. The Faculty shall announce the date of the examinations in advance.

Article 11

Thesis examinations will be given from time to time with respect to the thesis plan or laboratory report.

Article 12

Students may take examinations only for the courses for which they have applied pursuant to

the provisions of Article 7.

Article 13

- 1. The examination results shall be graded as A+, A, B, C and F. The grade of F results in a fail of the course. However, the assessment of study in the specific courses that are the courses such as exercises and practical training, etc. may be given as Completed.
- 2. Pursuant to the provisions of Articles 14-2 and 14-3 of the General Rules on Faculties, except for the grades prescribed in the preceding paragraph, the examination results for courses taken at a university abroad may be graded as pass or fail.

Article 14

Persons who intend to take thesis examinations must report to the dean of the Faculty the thesis plan or scope of experiment through the department in which they are enrolled and cause an academic adviser to be appointed five months before the thesis examinations.

Article 15

Each department and course program may prescribe that students who are enrolled in such department or course program may take thesis examinations only after they complete the specific courses and pass the examinations therefor.

Article 16 Transfer

Pursuant to the provisions of Article 10, paragraph 1, items (6) and (10) of the General Rules on Faculties, persons who have graduated from a junior college or a 5-year engineering school and who apply for admission to the Faculty, may be permitted to be admitted as prescribed separately.

Article 17

1. The program duration, maximum period of enrollment and period of a leave of absence of persons who are admitted to the Faculty pursuant to the provisions of Article 16 are as follows:

(1) Program Duration: three years
 (2) Maximum Period of Enrollment: five years
 (3) Period of Leave of Absence: two years or less

2. The courses and number of credits to be taken by the persons who are admitted to the Faculty pursuant to the provisions of Article 16 will be treated as prescribed separately.

Article 18 Readmission, Admission as a Post-baccalaureate Student, Transfer to another Faculty or Department

Readmission, admission as a post-baccalaureate student, transfer to another faculty or department as prescribed in Article 9 and Article 10, paragraph 1 of the General Rules on Faculties shall be as prescribed separately.

Article 19

The courses and the number of credits taken by, and the program duration and the maximum period of enrollment of, students who are admitted to the Faculty pursuant to the provisions of Article 18 shall be as prescribed separately.

Article 20 Research Students and Auditors

Research students and auditors shall be treated pursuant to the provisions of the General Rules on Faculties and as otherwise prescribed separately.
