Japan Education Fair 2014

The Japan Education Fair in New Delhi on August 4, 2014, brought together 9 universities from Japan, and attracted 1,300 participants, the largest turnout of high school and college students, teachers, parents, and others interested in Japanese higher education. The fair was organized by the Japan Student Services Organization (JASSO), co-organized by Ritsumeikan University and received support from the Embassy of Japan, Japan Foundation, MOSAI and The University of Tokyo.

The academic institutions that took part in the fair were Hokkaido University, Tohoku University, Waseda University, Keio University, Osaka University, Kyushu University, Ritsumeikan University, Shizuoka University, The University of Tokyo and Shinjuku Heiwa Japanese School. The Embassy of Japan, JASSO, Japan Foundation and MOSAI also set up booths to talk about the various support services available for international students studying in Japan. During the opening remarks, H.E. Ambassador of Japan to India, Mr. Yagi, presented a speech and conducted press interviews about higher education in Japan.
