### **Professional Experience as International Students Advisor:**

Since September 2001, I was a (Visiting during 2001; Regular from April 2003) Faculty at the Graduate School of Agricultural & Life Sciences (GSALS), The University of Tokyo. As in-charge of the Office for International Cooperation & Exchange (OICE), I was responsible for activities related to overseas students and international cooperation. Having myself experienced the challenges associated with studying abroad, especially for those without Japanese language ability, I dedicated my efforts to the OICE activities.

In addition to establishing and effectively managing the International Office for over 16 years until June 2017, I dedicated myself to matters related to research, career and personal counseling annually of the 250 plus International Students at the GSALS.
