Preparation for the program

- (1) Application process (please give any advice on dealing with the application process) motivation letter is the most important part

Invitation letter from the World Food System is needed when applying for the visa

High English proficiency is needed for this course. There are also some pre-assignment to be done and to read before the program. Search for the meaning of unfamiliar words in the pre-reading because you will hear it often in the program

Information on the academic/research program

Class from morning until evening, basically begin with the lecture, then discussion in small groups. There are also a small group project and presentation in the end of the program

For participants who don't have background about this topic before, I recommend you to finish as much reading materials as possible before the program, because the program is quite intense, the lectures cover a wide range of sub-topics concerning food system and organic agriculture.

It might be very good if you are working on project on organic agriculture or food security or food

safety because it's a very good chance to meet professors on these topics.

(3) Problems experienced with language issues, advice concerning language, etc.

Language does matter for this program. I suffered because I couldn't participate in the discussion and the group work that much because of the language problem.

### Aspects of life

(1) Accommodation (Type (home-stay, room-sharing etc.), cost, atmosphere/appearance of accommodation, how you found it, etc.)

Program fee: CHF700(transportation cost in not included) Every participant stays in the same big house with shared bedrooms and shared bathrooms (2-3persons/room). The room is nice and clean. The dining hall is at the first floor.

About an hour from Zurich Airport. Transportation(trains and buses) is convenient. The house is located in a small village surrounding with several farms and Rheine river. Very good atmosphere for learning.

It's quite safe there, but too quiet at night. Better not going out after sunset.

Airfare: around 170,000JPY(ANA), Program fees: 700CHF(food, room), no book required, travel cost: around 20 CHF from Zurich airport (one way), money spent on entertainment: vary from person to person

### Looking back over the program

(1) The significance of the program and how you have developed by taking part in it, any other impression from having studied abroad

Understanding about the whole picture of food value chain, and learning about each element in the value chain, from production, storage, processing, to distribution and consumption. At the same time considering the relationship between those elements, and considering what are the drivers, and the outcome of the chain. Moreover, the course also focus on the food safety, food security, and situation of malnutrition which is a very important topic for almost every country in the world. From this program, I learned how to work on food value chain systematically, learned that when working on food system, there is no single solution or a silver bullet to the problem, and because there are so many stakeholders concerning with the system, we need to work together in order to find the best solution that benefits majority. At the same time, we have to consider about an impact on environment as well.

It was a very intensive program, you should finished all the reading materials provided ,and it's better to have knowledge about agriculture and problems concerning food in Japan. (or in your own country) Moreover, most of the participants are master or PhD students, so for undergraduate students it might be a bit challenging. But overall, I like this program.
