The School of Art, Media and American Studies (AMA) at the University of East Anglia is offering 6 scholarships for PhD applicants from Japan, who plan to commence their studies at UEA in 2015/16. All those who apply will be considered and the six successful applicants will receive £6,750 per year against the cost of fees (£13,550 per year). A range of other scholarships also exist including two fully funded scholarships ring-fenced for international students in the Faculty of Arts and Humanities.

AMA has a reputation for world leading research and teaching, and has a vibrant and dynamic graduate community supported by a team of highly experienced supervisors. Applications are being sought from students with a strong academic track record to join the School's three core areas of research:

- Art history and museology
- Film, television and media studies

- American Studies

Candidates should hold a strong first degree, and a research proposal that briefly outlines the scholarship to which their research will be offering a contribution; the key research questions that the research will be exploring; and the research methods that will be used to answer these questions.
