3. REVISED

In this paper, the new method of <u>obtaining (achieving)</u> 3-dimensional MHD equilibria, Simulated Annealing (SA), is introduced. The SA method has been used to <u>maintain</u> steady states of 2-dimensional neutral fluids, but not 3-dimensional plasmas.

4. ORIGINAL

This novel system can <u>get rid of</u> artifacts and <u>get</u> a tomogram near the original true image.

4. REVISED

This novel system can <u>eliminate</u> artifacts and <u>produce</u> a tomogram nearer the true image.
