1. Program Objectives

This program aims to provide Go Global Gateway participants who are new to international interactions with an opportunity to gain experience abroad. The major topics of the course are cultural landscapes and environmental change of Australia. While attending this program both in Australia and in Japan, ANU and UTokyo students are expected to interact with each other and to develop motivation for pursuing further global experiences or careers.

2. Program Content

This program consists of two major parts: UTokyo/Japan part and ANU/Australia part.

For the UTokyo/Japan part, UTokyo students are required to attend the followings: the orientation (December 6), the welcome lunch for ANU students at the Komaba campus (January 10), the farewell lunch for ANU students at the Komaba campus (January 18) and the two-day program at Lake Yamanakako on January 12 and 13 (Stay the 12th night). Joining in lectures for ANU students is highly encouraged (January 9-18, at the Komaba campus).

The ANU/Australia part combines lectures at ANU, fieldtrips to various sites (the Canberra city center, museum, national park) and sessions at Pambula, the south coastal area of New South Wales. The learning is meant for students to achieve deep learning on nature, geoscience and aboriginal history while experiencing the society, culture and nature of current Australia. The ANU students who attended the UTokyo/Japan part in the early January will also participate in the lectures, fieldtrips and sessions.

No prior knowledge on those topics are required but learning about lecture contents in advance is recommended. All the lectures are offered in English. You do not have to understand everything but keeping efforts to listen is necessary.

-Cultural Landscapes and Environmental History

-Prehistory of Australia

-Prehistory and Environmental Change

6. Program Eligibility Criteria and Requirements

Applicants must meet all of the following requirements in addition to those listed on the Application Guidelines:

- (1) Students should possess an intermediate level of English (TOEFL iBT 65~80 is recommended.).
- (2) Students must aspire or at least consider an academic career abroad and have interest in taking lectures in foreign universities, studying English, and experiencing different cultures.
- (3) Submitting any English proficiency certificate is preferable, but not limited to holders. Students without an English proficiency certificate may apply.

7. Cost

- Air fare (around JPY 170,000. May differ depending on purchasing time.)
- Travel/study abroad insurance (around JPY 5,000.)
- OSSMA(around JPY 3,000.)
- Other expenses such as transportation and meals (around JPY 20,000.)

UTokyo will cover program fees worth A\$ 10,000 (Includes course/lecture fees and accommodation costs. Meals will not be covered). Students are responsible to pay other expenses (i.e. airfare, airport tax, insurance, passport & visa expenses and other personal expenses).

International Exchange Group will book return tickets for each UTokyo students. Students are responsible for wiring the airfare as required by International Exchange Group after the selection result is announced. On the arrival day in Australia, a bus will be chartered for the UTokyo student group.
