1. Program Objectives

This program aims to provide Go Global Gateway participants who are new to international interactions with an opportunity to gain experience abroad. Participants are expected to develop motivation for pursuing further global experiences or careers through taking a language course offered by University of Hawai'i at Mānoa and learning about Hawaiian history, languages, education and immigrant cultures. This program is funded by The Fung Scholarships^{**}.

2. Program Content

Students will attend the NICE (<u>New Intensive Courses in English</u>) Program organized by UHM for one week. Sessions and fieldtrips to organizations related to the session topics will be arranged to experience and learn cultures of Hawaii. The sessions will be particularly focused on Hawaiian "languages" as well as history and cultures, providing students with workshops on themes such as Hawaiian languages, immigrant languages, and Japanese as the foreign language.

(Session Topics)

- The Languages of Hawaii
- What's Hawaiian Pidgin?
- History of Hawaii
- History of Japanese Immigration
- Japanese as a Second/ Heritage Language etc.

*This program does not offer any credit.

*All classes are taught in English. As interaction opportunities with UHM students, a session or an activity with UHM students may be held during the program period.

6. Program Eligibility Criteria and Requirements

Applicants must meet all of the following requirements in addition to those listed on the Application Guidelines:

- (1) Students should possess an elementary level of proficiency in spoken English at minimum.
- (2) Students must aspire or at least consider an academic career abroad and have interest in taking lectures in foreign universities, studying English, and experiencing different cultures.
- (3) Submitting any English proficiency certificate is preferable, but not limited to holders. Students without an English proficiency certificate may apply.
- (4) Students must agree with the condition in which their personal information, such as name, contacts, affiliations etc., may be given to ^{*}Victor and William Fung Foundation, the provider or the Fung Scholarship, through UTokyo.
- (5) Students must read and watch reference materials which will be designated during the pre-orientation 1 in December in advance of the pre-orientation 2 in March. Students must actively participate in the discussion on the preparation during pre-orientation 2.

7. Cost

- Air fare (around JPY 150,000. May differ depending on purchasing time.)
- Travel/study abroad insurance (around JPY 5,000.)
- Other expenses such as WiFi fees, transportation and meals (around JPY 30,000.)

A scholarship called "The Fung Scholarships" will fund this program. The scholarships will cover tuition and homestay fees worth \$2000 (Includes breakfast and dinner during homestay.) through UTokyo. Students are responsible to pay other expenses (i.e. airfare, airport tax, insurance, passport & visa expenses, and other personal expenses).

International Exchange Group will book return tickets for each UTokyo student. Students are responsible for paying the airfare as required by International Exchange Group after the selection result is announced. Host family will provide airport pick-up/drop-off.

8. Accommodation

Homestay with a local Hawaiian family. Two students/room or two students/family in separate rooms.
