

1. Program Objectives

This program aims to provide Go Global Gateway participants who are new to international interactions with an opportunity to gain experience abroad. Holding the main theme, “gender,” the program combines lectures on various topics (German politics, history, education, gender and diversity) and language-focused courses to acquire the German language (introductory level). Participants are expected to develop motivation for pursuing further global experiences or careers throughout this program.

2. Program Content

The program is specially designed for UTokyo students. The program contents include academic lectures by FUB professors, fieldtrips to organizations related to the lecture topics and an introductory-level German course. Refer to the “2019 FU-UTokyo Tentative Program Schedule” for more details.

*All lectures are offered in English. As interaction opportunities with FUB students, some of the lectures or sessions during the program may be held inviting FUB students. Note that regular university courses are not being offered during the program period, so that the interaction opportunities might be limited.

*As for the German language course, participants will be divided into groups depending on their language levels (Expected levels: Introductory to threshold/upper intermediate). Applicants of this program are required to report their levels of the German language on the Application Form (See Section 8. Language Proficiency on the form. True beginners of the German language may apply as well.)

3. Program Period

(Arrive in Berlin on Feb. 22. / Depart from Berlin on Mar. 6.)

6. Program Eligibility Criteria and Requirements

Applicants must meet all of the following requirements in addition to those listed on the Application

Guidelines:

- (1) Students should possess an intermediate level of English (TOEFL iBT 65~80 is recommended.).
- (2) Students must aspire or at least consider an academic career abroad and have interest in taking lectures in foreign universities, studying German and English, and experiencing different cultures.
- (3) Submitting any English proficiency certificate is preferable, but not limited to holders. Students without an English proficiency certificate may apply.

7. Cost

- Air fare (around JPY 170,000. May differ depending on purchasing time.)
- Travel/study abroad insurance (around JPY 5,000.)
- Other expenses such as meals (around JPY 30,000.)

UTokyo will cover program fees worth 1400 euros (Includes course/lecture fees, accommodation costs, a bus card, breakfast and lunch. Dinner is not included.). Students are responsible to pay other expenses (i.e. airfare, airport tax, insurance, passport & visa expenses and other personal expenses).

International Exchange Group will book return tickets for each UTokyo student. Students are responsible for paying the airfare as required by International Exchange Group after the selection result is announced.

8. Accommodation

Student hostel reserved by FUB. (Single room with shared bathroom)

9. Orientation

After internal selection, mandatory orientations for participants will be held as listed below. Attending both orientations is required.
