Description and Aim

The 26th UN Climate Change Conference of the Parties (COP26) was held at the end of 2021 and the Sixth Assessment Report of the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) was published. It is almost certain that the effects of climate change will be obvious in various sectors in our society, and there is an urgent need for social change to mitigate climate change to minimize the effect including droughts, floods, natural resources, disasters such as landslides, heat waves, and sea level rise. These changes will cause food, livelihoods, transportation, health, and cultural inheritance. At UNU Global Seminar 2022, we would like to discuss the impacts of climate change in the three areas: biodiversity, water and education.

At the seminar, the keynote speech will be delivered by three prominent researchers in the world related to biodiversity, water, and education. Groupwork will be organized to discuss impact and solution of the effect of climate change. Finally, innovative solution will be proposed by participants groups.

Learning Outcomes

Participants will:

- Engage with prominent leaders across fields and disciplines such as biodiversity, water and education to learn about the contemporary global issues related to each area and understand the sustainable initiatives.
- Obtain skill how to tackle the global issues with multiple aspects by planned groupworks step-by-step applying the world café style.
- Enhance communication capability and skill in making a consensus among the team members through the
 preparation for the presentation for the innovative solution about the impact and solution of the effect of
 climate change
- Make a network with other participants from different university and with diverse backgrounds through the world café style discussion and preparation for the presentations.
