Nomination and Application Process

Application Process	<p>Students will be emailed a link to our online application form and will need to upload the following documents in English:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Information page of valid passport• Official academic transcript (including past and current enrolment)• Official English proficiency test results (if applicable)• Details of proposed courses (Course Code, Course Number, Course Title and teaching semester)• Copies of course descriptions/syllabi for applicable courses taken at home university (for subject areas noted in Course Assessment section below).
Application & Course Assessment	<p>Applications will be assessed and the students' preferred courses will be sent to the appropriate faculties for approval if required. The faculties will look at the student's transcript and course descriptions from the home university to determine the students' suitability for enrolment into the desired courses.</p> <p>Courses from the following areas require approval prior to enrolment: Criminology, Education, Health Sciences, Languages, Law, MBA, Media, Music, Sciences.</p>
Offer & Acceptance	<p>An Offer of Admission will be emailed directly to the student, with cc to the home university. Students need to complete the payment for their Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC) (if applicable). Details of the payment method are outlined in the Offer of Admission. Students will need to return all pages of the signed and completed Offer of Admission.</p>
Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE) & Student Visa	<p>Once the OSHC payment is received and the signed Offer of Admission is returned, the University of Adelaide issues a Confirmation of Enrolment (cc to home university) which is a required document to obtain a student visa.</p> <p>All students must obtain an appropriate visa. Enrolment	<p>Welcome emails are sent 120 days before the course start date or when the admission process is completed (whichever occurs later). The welcome email contains the student's ID number and information on how to activate their account which will enable them to log in to the University's online services. Please visit adelaide.edu.au/enrol for further information about University enrolment.</p>

Arrival Information	Adelaide Airport is approximately a twenty minute taxi ride to the city. Taxis are readily available at the designated taxi rank which is located to the left hand side of the main terminal as you exit. Academic Information

Course Weighting	<p>The full-time semester course load requirement is between 9 units (75% workload) and 12 units (100% workload). Courses offered are usually weighted at 3 units each.</p> <p>12 UoA units = 30 ECTS = 60 UK Credits = 15 US Credits</p>
Unavailable & Restricted Courses	<p>Unavailable Courses - courses not offered to Exchange students.</p> <p>Restricted Courses - courses may be available but have prerequisites and/or limited availability.</p> <p>Courses that require assessment and approval are from the following areas:</p> <p>Criminology, Education, Languages,</p> <p>Law, MBA, Media,</p> <p>Music, Public Health, Sciences.</p> <p>Further information about unavailable and restricted courses can be found at: adelaide.edu.au/inbound-study-abroad/choosing</p>
Course Selection & Information	<p>Undergraduate students can select from a wide range of courses. We recommend that students' selections are flexible. Students who are very restricted in their course selection need to inform us as early as possible. All courses offered are subject to change and availability. adelaide.edu.au/inbound-study-abroad/choosing</p>
Course Levels	<p>1XXX - 3XXX = Undergraduate courses.</p> <p>Eg: ARTS 1000 - Introductory Level, ARTS 2000 - Intermediate Level, ARTS 3000 Advanced Level</p> <p>These are usually available to Exchange students, except for those areas that are restricted or unavailable. Some disciplines will need to be approved by the School or Faculty.</p> <p>4XXX = Honours courses. Mostly restricted with some exceptions provided at faculty discretion.</p> <p>5XXX - 7XXX = Postgraduate courses. Only available to Exchange students who have completed an undergraduate degree (or equivalent).</p> <p>Students are not able to study Undergraduate and Postgraduate courses concurrently.</p>



Admission Requirements

Length of Study	Students must have completed one year of study at their home university, but are able to apply for Exchange after one semester of results.
Grade Point Average (GPA)	The students' GPA must meet or be equivalent to at least 2.5 out of 4.0 .
Language of Instruction	English

All applicants must demonstrate an acceptable level of English proficiency to gain admission to the University. Students from majority native English speaking countries (listed on our [website](#)) do not have to provide evidence of English proficiency.

There are two categories of English requirements for entry, dependent on the courses chosen:

General Academic Level: Most undergraduate and postgraduate courses.

TOEFL (internet based)	Total score of 79; Writing 21, Speaking 18, Reading and Listening 13
Pearson Test of English	Overall score of 58; Writing, Speaking, Reading and Listening 50
Cambridge C1 Advanced	Overall score of 176; Writing, Speaking, Reading and Listening 169

Alternative Proof of English Proficiency

Accepted tests of alternative English language proficiency are listed on our webpage including:

- Native English language speakers (certain citizenships)
- Students currently studying full degree in English
- Special requirements for certain countries:

Students who have completed their secondary schooling in Austria, Belgium, Denmark, Finland, France, Germany, Hong Kong, Netherlands, Norway, Sweden or Switzerland are required to submit evidence of having achieved specific grades in their high school English language exams.

Evidence of the above is required to be submitted in the application.
