■留学を決めるまでの経緯/How and why did you decide to study abroad?:

I wanted to experience a life in North America as I was considering studying in the region after my undergraduate studies. I also wanted to gain a new experience in general, along with new friends from different background.

■留学にあたってこの時期を選んだ理由/Reason for choosing this period to study abroad:

I decided to study abroad during the 1st semester of the 3rd year, right after completing my junior division and before starting taking courses in senior division. This way, I could manage the credit requirements easily without having to worry too much about it after I come back from the study abroad.

■留学中の学習・研究の概要/Overview of the study/research during study abroad:

The lecture sizes are fairly big with at least 100 students per course. The lectures were mostly unidirectional but some of the courses required participation in labs that took place outside the usual class time. These labs are conducted with a small number of students per session and helps students practice or review what they learned in the course.

■学習・研究以外の活動で取り組んだものの内容、または取り組まなかった理由/Details of the activities you chose, or the reason why you did not take part in any activity other than study/research:

The university provides a range of cultural activities for international students. For example, I participated in a Japanese Culture Club gathering that took place at least once a month where I could meet local students who were interested in the Japanese culture and even in the University of Tokyo for an exchange program.

■週末や長期休暇の過ごし方/How did you spend the weekends and vacations?:

I mostly hung out with other international friends in the downtown or in other cities that are nearby such as Vancouver.

派遣先大学の環境について/About environment at the host institution

■設備/Facilities:

The Wifi was fairly fast and stable in the entire campus. The facilities such as the libraries and gym were relatively clean and new, making them very pleasant to use. Also in terms of the main library, it provided a range of study zones from a quietstudy area to a group study area.

■サポート体制/Support for students:

The university's international program team (especially the team in charge of exchange students) provided a lot of support such as an orientation program prior to the beginning of the semester or cultural activities on a regular basis. The university itself was also open about mental health of students, having a multifaith center designated to support the students in maintaining good mental health conditions through meditation or therapy, whether religiously or non-religiously.

■宿泊先の種類/Type of accommodation:

Students' dormitory

■宿泊先の様子、どのように見つけたか/Environment around the accommodation and how did you find it:

I stayed in the on-campus dormitory where each student is provided with an individual room. The host university offers a plenty of options available for international students including the dormitories with shared rooms, which are cheaper than those with individual rooms, and those with or without kitchens. However, it

is fairly competitive to get a room due to the no-guarantee system for short-term international students. The information was shared during the online information session the host university held for incoming international students.

■気候、大学周辺の様子、交通機関、食事等/Climate, environment around the institution, transportation, food, etc. :

The climate is overall very rainy and humid, especially from November to December. For this, I do recommend bringing waterproof apparels such as rain coats. The food in the on-campus dormitory could be bought using the meal plan the university includes in the dormitory pricing. However, it had limited options so relying too much on the meal plan could be a bit risky. In terms of transportation, there is only bus available for the public one.

■お金の管理方法、現地の通貨事情/Management of money and situation about local economy:

I did not have to open a local bank account as I brought cash and credit cards that can be used abroad. However, it is still recommended to open a bank account so that someone, such as parents outside the country, can wiretransfer funds from home, as the university sometimes requires payment only through wire transfer or a local bank account.

■治安、医療関係事情、心身の健康管理で気をつけたこと等、危機管理/Aspects of risk and safety management, local health care system, and any actions taken to maintain your health:

The campus is very safe with the campus security and some buildings that are open 24/7. However, outside the campus, safety is not guaranteed as there may be homeless or people smoking cannabis. The local health care system is not as readily available as in Japan or other east Asian countries (i.e. you might need to make an appointment for a doctor months in advance).

留学前の準備・手続きについて/About preparations and procedures before studying abroad

■留学先への入学手続き/Procedures for enrollment required by the host institution:

I had to submit a copy of my passport, transcript, and a list of currently registered courses (courses that do not appear in the official transcript). In addition to these documents, I only had to submit my personal information such as my nationality and birth date.

■ビザの手続き/Procedures to obtain visas:

I did not have to apply for the visa nor study permit as my study abroad experience did not exceed 6 months, which is the period the Canadian Government set to divide the documentation requirement among international students.

■医療関係の準備/Preparations or actions taken to maintain your health:

I bought tylenol and ibuprofen in case of emergency after I arrived in the country. I do recommend bringing a first aid kit before coming to the study abroad country.

■保険関係の準備/Preparations/procedures for insurance:

The University of Tokyo requires overseas travel insurances and I registered it along with the insurance required for another study abroad program I participated in right before this exchange program. The partner university also required a Canadian insurance that was designed for short-term international students. For the latter, I would recommend making a payment in advance as they only accept Canadian credit cards or wire transfer.

■東京大学の所属学部・研究科(教育部)での手続き/Procedures required by faculties or graduate schools at UTokyo:

I had to submit an application form for a leave of absence and a letter of acceptance to my faculty. In the application form for a leave of absence, I also had to write down my plans for the courses in the partner university and get an approval from the program director. This process was not difficult as my course registration for the partner university took place before the deadline.

■語学関係の準備/Language preparation:

The program required a minimum of TOEFL iBT 90 as all the courses are conducted in English. I did not have to prepare for the language requirement as I already had a TOEFL score that exceeded the minimum score. But apart from the requirement itself, the study abroad experience in general would be better with the ability to have daily conversations (such as understanding the cultures or having a proficient speaking skills).

留学を振り返って/Reflection

■留学の意義、その他所感/Impact of the study abroad experience on yourself or your thoughts:

It was overall very satisfying as I was able to meet my goals of experiencing and gaining knowledge on living abroad after my graduation. I was also satisfied with the university as they provided a lot of support for international students. However, it was a little challenging in the beginning when I had to start a new life in an environment I have never experienced before and start from scratch. Even making new friends became a source of pressure.

I am considering going to a graduate school abroad after my undergraduate studies, as I am overall satisfied with the experience of living outside Japan. However, I do also want to try other regions such as Europe or other parts of Asia.

I think this experience will serve as an evidence that proves my global competence and language abilities, contributing to a success in my future career.

■今後留学を考えている学生へのメッセージ、アドバイス/Any messages or advice for future participants:

Studying abroad requires a lot of commitment and preparation, and the experience of living abroad itself is also challenging. However, keeping in mind that this experience is for a short-period of time and only serves as a new experience will help lessening the pressure. Mental health is most important when it comes to adjusting in a new environment, and you need to make sure to reach out to people who can help you if you confront an issue. Do also try to have a lot fun by making new friends and participating in cultural activities, rather than merely studying.
