1. オンライン申請の注意事項

応募完了後、本学において学内選考を行い、派遣候補学生を UC デービスに推薦する。学内選考を通過した学生宛に国際教育推進課からオンライン申請の案内を行うので、その指示に従い指定した締切日までにオンライン申請を完了すること。その際、授業料及び生活費の総額（1クォーターあたり授業料約 8,500 米ドル、生活費約 4,500-5,500 米ドル）以上の銀行残高証明書（英文・米ドル建て併記）が必要となるため、予め準備しておくこと。

2. 参加決定後の手続き

参加が認められた学生には UC デービスから Admission Packet が送付される予定である。以下に記す手続きのほか、出発までの準備は UC デービスから届く書類やパンフレット等を参考にしながら、現地までの移動を含め、各自で手配を行うこと。

3. 参加費の支払い

UC デービスでの選考が完了し参加が認められると、学生には UC デービスより支払い額・支払い方法の詳細を記載した請求書が送られてくる。必ず期日までに支払いを行うこと。支払いの確認が行われないと授業への登録はできない。また、支払い後に参加を辞退しなければならない場合、返金手続きや返金内容は UC デービスの規定に従う必要があるため注意すること。

なお、支払い方法は、クレジットカード払いまたは海外送金のみでの支払いとなる。

※送金の際は必ず「参加する quarter, year, full student name and home university」を明記すること。

4. プログラム参加中の保険・危機管理対策

本プログラム参加学生は UC Davis International Student Health Insurance Plan に加入することとなっているが、本学学生は留学中の保険として、公益財団法人日本国際教育支援協会（JEES）の学研災付帯海外留学保険「付帯海学」に必ず加入することとなっている。また、危機管理対策として、日本エマージェンシーアシスタンス（株）の派遣学生危機管理サービス OSSMA（Overseas Student Safety Management Assistance）への加入も必須である。本学の規定として本プログラムへの参加にあたっては、これらの保険・サービスへの加入は必須条

件とする（加入に要する経費は自己負担となる）。加入に当たっての詳細はプログラム参加決定学生に追って通知する。「付帯海学」へ加入することで、UC デービス指定保険への加入免除が認められる可能性があるため、UC デービスから案内される免除申請に従い、各自で申請を行うこと。ただし、加入免除が認められない場合は、「付帯海学」と UC デービス指定保険の両方に加入する必要があるため、予め了承の上本プログラムに申請すること。

The Global Study Program Details outlines the program for the 2023-2024 academic year.¹

1. Academic Calendar, 2024-25

2024 - 2025 Dates

Summer Session I 2024: June 24 – August 2
Summer Session II 2024: August 5 – September 13
Fall Quarter 2024: September 25 – December 13
Winter Quarter 2025: January 6 – March 21
Spring Quarter 2025: March 31 – June 12

**Prospective GSP students may apply for one session/quarter or combination of different terms mentioned above.

Academic Year covers three quarters (Fall/Winter/Spring). “Fall Semester” consists of Summer Session II and Fall Quarter. “Spring Semester” consists of Spring Quarter and Summer Session I.

2024-2025 Suggested Application Deadlines

Summer 2024: March 15, 2024
Fall 2024: May 1, 2024
Winter 2025: October 1, 2024
Spring 2025: January 5, 2025

*Application deadlines can be flexible as needed by partner institution

**Summer Session final exams are held during the last meeting of the class in the 6th week. Fall, Winter, and Spring Quarter courses meet for 10 weeks of lecture. Final exams are held during the 11th week.

2. Academic Credit

GSP students earn University of California academic credit for all campus classes. UC credit is awarded on a quarter “unit” basis, generally considered equivalent to 67% of a US college semester credit. Students who successfully complete GSP academic-prep language classes will be awarded continuing education units credit at a rate of 1 unit per 10 hours of instruction. In general students carry a minimum of 12 units and a maximum of 13 units of approved UC Davis credit courses. Exceptional students may petition to take up to 16 units of approved credit.

3. Program Benefits

Global Study Program students are eligible for all UC Davis undergraduate student services*, including, but not limited to:

- Pre-arrival course registration in nearly all UC Davis departments
- Internship placement through the Internship and Career Center
- Independent research with professors
- 24/7 access to the library and study rooms
- Use of the state-of-the-art Activities and Recreation Center
- Participation in student sports, clubs, and activities

* Students enrolled in the ESL Preparation Program are billed at a lower tuition rate and may not have access to all of these amenities. Please refer to the “Program Structure” attachment for more information.

4. Admission Criteria

- Recommendation of the home university
- A grade point average (GPA) equivalent to a 3.0 on a 4.0 grade scale (B average).
- Demonstrated advanced-level English proficiency

5. Pricing

Application fee

\$200 (**waived** for Partner Universities)

2024-2025 Tuition*

- \$8,500 per Quarter**
- \$12,500 per Semester (1 Summer Session plus 1 quarter, i.e. Summer 2 plus Fall OR Spring plus Summer 1). Semester price includes a \$250 discount
- \$25,150 per Academic Year (3 quarters, paid in full in advance). Includes additional \$350 discount.***

*Students enrolled in intensive English courses are billed at a lower tuition rate.

** The tuition and fees payment amounts represent tuition and campus student fees per student.

***Academic Year payments must be paid in full by the payment deadline in order to be eligible for the discount rate (covers 3 academic quarters).

Tuition and fee rates include a full-time course-load equivalent to 12/13 units per quarter. Course fees are pending the State's final budget and approval by the Regents of the University of California. All fees are subject to change with advance notice.

Late payments are subject to additional \$100 fee.

6. Payment Arrangements

a) Payment Details for Students

Students will be provided with pricing sheets, due dates, and payment instructions upon confirmation of admission to the Global Study Program. Payments are due prior to the start of each quarter. Course registration will only be confirmed after receipt of payment. Late fees will apply if payment is not received by the start of each quarter.

b) Payment Methods

Students can pay by credit card or wire transfer including Flywire. Students paying by wire transfer should reference the following information.

c) Estimated Expenses

Although individual spending habits vary, we recommend that students budget \$4,500 to \$5,500 U.S. dollars per academic quarter. The following chart provides a sample breakdown of expenses. Note that the financial statement will need to include a minimum amount for living expenses in addition to tuition fees. This is for the immigration documents. The living expenses are determined by our immigration office on a yearly basis.

Summary of Estimated Expenses

Housing	\$1000-1400 per month
Food/meals	\$ 450 per month
Local transportation	University and local public buses are included in student registration fee. A bicycle is a worthwhile expenditure.
Academic expenses (e.g., books, stationery)	\$200-500 per academic quarter
Personal items	Varies
Campus recreation and activities	Optional sports activities, craft or personal interest classes for \$50-150

**Please note the estimated expenses above do not include travel and excursion expenses throughout the United States. If a student is planning on traveling and vacationing during the course of the program they should budget additional funds.

7. UC Davis International Student Health Insurance Plan

This comprehensive plan provides access to high-quality, affordable medical services on-and off-campus. Purchasing this plan does not mean that you receive free medical care. It does mean that the cost of your medical care is significantly reduced -- you pay only a portion of your medical costs and the insurance pays a portion of your medical costs. This is also true of virtually all health insurance plans in the United States. Translated versions of the brochure are available in Korean, Japanese, Chinese, French, Portuguese, Spanish and Turkish. Any student who already carries equivalent medical insurance coverage may apply for a waiver instead of purchasing this insurance; such students should be prepared to pay in advance for any medical care and seek reimbursement from their insurer. UC Davis policy requires that they have a minimum total coverage of \$500,000 and the following provisions:

- Medical benefits of at least \$50,000 per accident or illness
- Repatriation of remains in the amount of \$25,000
- Expenses associated with medical evacuation in the amount of \$10,000
- Deductible not to exceed \$500 per accident or illness.

8. Accommodation

We offer two excellent housing options for Global Study Program students: rental apartments or home-stay arrangements. GSP students make their own housing arrangements with guidance from GSP advisors. Housing options include:

- a. **Rental Apartments.** Some students prefer to secure their own accommodations, perhaps through friends or relatives. A housing website popular with UC Davis students is <https://chl.ucdavis.edu/>
- b. **Homestay with a Local Family.** Our office helps individual students with a variety of housing options, including homestay, apartments and dormitories (summers only). If you have been admitted to the program and would like more information or assistance in finding a homestay, please contact globalstudy@ucdavis.edu.

At present on-campus dormitories are not available.

9. Student Conduct

- a. All Global Study Program students are required to adhere to UC Davis and UC Davis Continuing and Professional Education, International academic and behavior standards as outlined in the Global Study Program Arrival Handbook. UC Davis Continuing and Professional Education, International reserves the right to dismiss any student from the program who fails to meet the University of California academic, attendance, or behavioral standards.
- b. Students are required to maintain a minimum grade point average of 2.0 at all times and will be asked to meet with a Global Study Program advisor to discuss any failed class or other unfavorable report from an instructor. Global Study Program advisors will closely monitor participating students, their academic and personal progress and will consult with the home university on issues of serious concern. Students who receive failing grades for multiple quarters will be subject to dismissal.

10. Transcripts and Certificates of Completion

Students receive two final transcripts (one official copy is sent directly to the home university) approximately 2 months following the conclusion of their study abroad at UC Davis. Students may also receive a certificate of completion after the successful conclusion of their studies.

Program Structure

All admitted students are placed in course schedules based on the English proficiency score results submitted with their application. Students without qualifying scores will be placed in intensive English (ESL) Courses for their first term. In order to progress to Guided Full-Time Academic coursework on the UC Davis campus, students must achieve a TOEFL score of 530 PBT, earn a B or better average in their English-language courses, and have the consent of the Global Study Program Academic Coordinator.

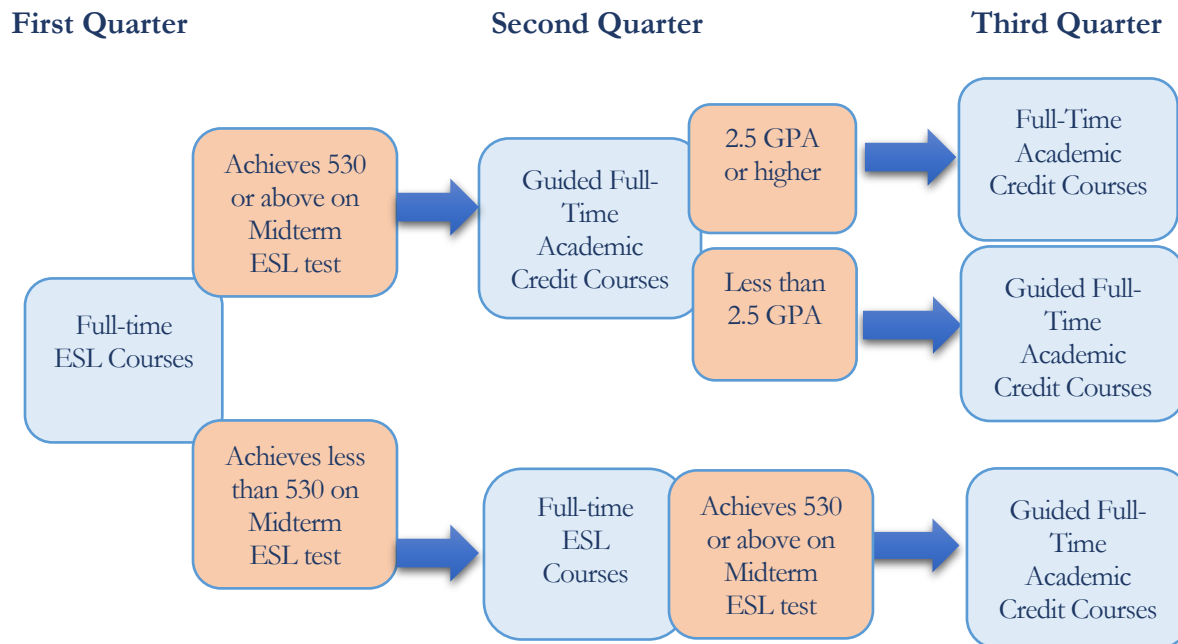
Transition to Full-time Academic Courses

Students will be expected to achieve B grades or higher in ESL coursework. Students will be given the opportunity to take a midterm TOEFL-equivalent exam and if they are able to achieve a score of 530 PBT or above they will be allowed to take full-time academic credit courses (Guided Full-Time Academic Credit) in the next quarter.

Students participating in the Full-Time ESL or Guided Full-Time Academic Credit schedules will receive additional staff support. Guided Full-Time students will meet with course advisors to determine which academic courses will benefit the students most. Students in both course schedules will receive one-on-one advising on time management, course planning, and test preparation.

Note: Students will have the opportunity to request taking classes on a Pass/No Pass basis, rather than for a letter grade. In order to be approved for Pass/No Pass, the student must have the approval of the home university. Classes taken according to this grading scale contribute to the student’s overall unit count, but they do not impact the overall GPA. Keep in mind that some classes are not available for Pass/No Pass due to departmental restrictions.

Global Study Program Students Use Drama to Build Communication Skills and Confidence



Strong communication and presentation skills are valuable in any setting. But for GSP students at UC Davis, learning to communicate effectively in English is not only essential for academic success, it is also empowering. In addition to helping students both inside and outside the classroom, being a confident speaker helps them develop important soft skills for success in a variety of professional environments. The course *Presentation, Communication and Collaboration Skills*, offered in conjunction with the UC Davis Department of Theater and Dance, is highly regarded by students as an opportunity to experience something unique that may not be available at their home universities.

The goal of the course is to help students develop clear oral and physical communication and collaboration skills that build confidence, presentational style and clarity while using the English language. They also build essential soft skills that employers value, such as teamwork, interpersonal communication, creative problem solving, empathy, adaptability, critical thinking, open mindedness, dependability, organization and a willingness to grow. Students engage with classmates in formal and informal settings and are challenged to think outside the box with fun exercises ranging from group storytelling to TED Talk-style presentations.

“The course is experiential and participatory in nature. The majority of what we do is based on human interaction and communication,” says instructor Michele Apríña Leavy. “Many of these students do not have theater or acting classes in their home universities. This course offers a practical opportunity to learn communication skills that apply in the real world as they navigate a global community and encounter people with different cultural mores and work environments.” Leavy adds, “One of the biggest gifts I hope the students take away from this class is a strong sense of achievement, self-confidence, self-acceptance and a greater ease and facility with the English language.”
