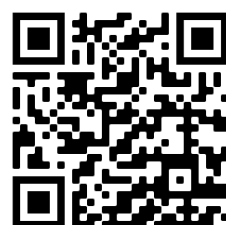

## Nomination & Application

### Nomination procedure

All students must be nominated at the MSD before the nomination deadline. Please send the nomination form as provided annually by the University of Groningen to: [mfe@rug.nl](mailto:mfe@rug.nl)



### Deadline nominations

Fall semester: April 15th

Spring semester: September 15th

### Application procedure

Our office will process the nominations and we will make sure the relevant faculty will get this application; upon receipt of the nomination, the faculty will contact the student to inform them of the next steps in the process.

### Deadline applications

Fall semester: May 1st

Spring semester: October 1st

**IMPORTANT:** Students will be asked to fill out one other on-line application form by the faculty of their choice. It is therefore important that students apply before our deadline.

### Application documents

Students are asked to upload the following documents:

- Official academic transcript of records, in English
- English language test results (if applicable)
- Nomination letter Home University
- Passport copy

### English requirements

Toefl (internet based only for 2024): 90 (with a minimum of 21 per section)

IETLS: 6.5 (with a minimum of 6.0 per section)

NB: Do check the website of the individual faculties, as the requirements might differ per faculty.

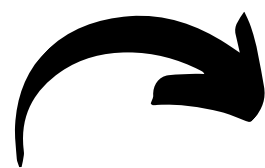

## Practical matters

### Immigration requirements

All non-EU students must either have a residence permit or an MVV visa and a residence permit in order to study in The Netherlands. Our International Students Desk will accompany this process.

### Financial requirements

In order to get a residence permit or an MVV and residence permit combined, students must show sufficient financial means:

One semester: €5.000,-

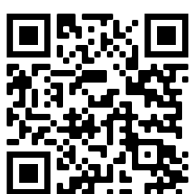
Full year starting in September: €12.000,-

Full year starting in February: €12.000,-

The application fees to apply for a residence permit or on MVV and residence permit combined: €210,-

### Housing information

Students will receive information from the international office of their faculty, to apply for housing with the housing office.

## Courses at the University of Groningen

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### ECTS and grading system

The Netherlands higher education institutions adopted the ECTS system officially in 2002. One ECTS credit represents 28 hours of full-time study (including contact hours, reading, independent study, preparation for exams etc.), and 60 ECTS credits represent one year.

The Dutch grading scale runs from 10 (highest mark) to 1 (lowest mark), in which 5.5 is the minimum pass mark. Grades 9 and 10 are rarely awarded.

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### Transcript of Records

By the end of the semester, students will receive information from the faculty on how to apply for a transcript. Students must instruct the faculty to send the transcript to the international office of their home institution. Please be aware that many faculty only send out digital transcripts.
