Academic Calendar

The academic year at Peking University, from early September to July, is divided into two semesters, each of 18 weeks duration, including 16 weeks of classroom attendance and 2 examination weeks. The autumn semester starts in early September and ends in mid January of the following year, while the spring semester begins in late February and ends in late June.

Your Studies

To become an exchange student you need to be officially nominated by your home university and cannot apply directly to PKU. Please contact the International Office at your home university if you wish to study at PKU as an exchange student.

Peking University offers Chinese language training courses and undergraduate courses, allowing university-wide exchange students to choose courses across schools/departments. Regular graduate courses are taught in Chinese, and the availability of such courses depends on the schools/departments' permission. English-taught graduate courses are not open, as such courses belong to special Master programs (MBA, Master in International Relations, Master in Public Policy, LLM in Chinese Law, Yenching Academy, etc.).

What courses can I take?

If you are **not proficient in Chinese**, you may choose one from the following two options:

- Include in the School of Chinese as a Second Language (SCSL) to mainly study Chinese. At the same time, you are also permitted to take English-taught subject courses of no more than 6 credits in total each semester at other schools/ departments if the courses and quotas are available.
- Relinquish SCSL's Chinese language courses and only take English-taught subject courses at other schools/departments.

If you are **proficient in Chinese**, you can apply to take subject courses (Chinese-taught /English-taught) at other schools/departments.

How am I to test my Chinese language proficiency?

If you are not native Chinese speaker, you may test your Chinese language proficiency by sitting in the HSK exam (Level 6).

How am I graded?

You will receive an official transcript approximately two months after you completed exchange at PKU. Please consult your home university concerning the credit transfer.

Courses

Chinese language courses

Visiting students who plan to study Chinese will be enrolled at the PKU School of Chinese as a Second Language (SCSL). Chinese language courses, designed particularly for international students, are divided into elementary, intermediate, and advanced levels, each level including Chinese compulsory courses and elective courses (language beginners only have compulsory courses). Class size is approximately fifteen students. Normally class hours are allocated in the morning and afternoon, from Monday to Friday, four class hours per day, eighteen to twenty class hours per week. Different from PKU undergraduate courses, Chinese language courses are training courses, therefore they have class hours but NO credits.

Compulsory courses of each level (elementary/intermediate/advanced) include one intensive Chinese course and one spoken Chinese course.

Normally the list of undergraduate courses available for the coming semester is released in middle January/July.

Some courses are not offered every semester, and the courses that you want to read or need to read may not be available for you in your exchange period.

Research programs

Master/PhD exchange students may join in the research programs if they do not plan to take any PKU courses. They normally conduct research with PKU professors and do not follow courses (Chinese language courses/undergraduate/graduate courses) as regular exchange students. Senior undergraduate students could also be enrolled in the research programs, on the conditions that the PKU professor agrees to accept the student into his/her research project.

Housing Options

Peking University will assist exchange students in finding on-campus accommodation in accordance with the bilateral student exchange agreement signed between PKU and its partner institutions. Please check first with your home university whether the bilateral student exchange agreement covers free accommodation.

For the free accommodation under the agreement:

Your dormitory will be in the Zhongguanyuan Global Village, Building No.5.

Location at the east gate of Peking University, 5 minutes' walking distance to major classroom buildings.

Room type two international students share one room.

Cost of Living

	COSTS
Living cost	Ranging from RMB 1000 - 3000 Yuan per month depending on individuals; Students can survive with every little cost on campus which provides basically everything including food, grocery, laundry, books, internet, etc.
Accommodation	Ranging from RMB 2000-5000 Yuan per month depending on location and room condition.
University fee	Normally exchange students do not pay any application, tuition or administrative fees as per the university bilateral agreement.
Local Transportation	Public transportation is as cheap as 2 Yuan for bus, less than 10 Yuan for subway.
Insurance	Exchange students MUST purchase the designated medical insurance plan in China for a cost of RMB 300 Yuan per semester.

Scholarship Funding

Both the Chinese Government Scholarship and the Confucius Institute Scholarship are open to exchange students. Scholarship applicants who are already officially nominated by Peking University's partner universities for exchange under the agreement will be preferentially admitted.

Please consult the Chinese embassy in your country for more application information.

The free accommodation covered under the Chinese Government Scholarship/ the Confucius Institute Scholarship is double room, with two international students sharing the room. Independent bathroom is not available in the room but there is bathroom on each floor. Laundry and kitchens are also available in the building.
