You will not be required to send any documents to the university. The entire nomination and application process is online.

German as a Foreign Language (DaF)

German Language Courses
A1 – C1 of the CEFR

One German language course for exchange students is free of charge. Students can choose between the **pre-semester course** with 20h/week (online) or **semester course** with 6h/week (hybrid).

Pre-Semester
20h/week (online)

Level A1 is conducted as an online self-study course including interactive and tutored sessions for 4 weeks. Courses on level A2 – C1 are conducted as online courses with 20h/week à 45 minutes for 4 weeks.

Semester Course
6h/week (hybrid)

Level A1 is conducted as an online self-study course including interactive and tutored sessions for 12 weeks. Courses on level A2 – C1 are conducted as hybrid courses with 6h/week held in 2 sessions. One session is held online, the other session is in-person at UoC.

Health Insurance

Pre-Semester
(March or September)

If you are travelling to Cologne before the start of the semester, we recommend to take out a travel health insurance.

Semester
(October or April)

You need a proof of health insurance coverage from a German statutory health insurer or an exemption certificate from a German statutory health insurer for your enrolment. A German statutory health insurance costs approx. **130 EUR** per month.

Visa Requirements

It is your responsibility to familiarise yourself with the visa conditions for entry to Germany before you arrive. You must apply for a residence permit within 90 days of your arrival.

Semester Fee

The UoC does not charge any tuition fees. However, all students must pay a social contribution fee of around **320 EUR** per semester. This fee also includes the "Deutschlandsemesterticket" – it is a personalised digital ticket for one semester. It is valid throughout Germany on local public transportation.
