I attended weekly seminars of the Fox Fellows and seminars on comparative politics and research methods. I met with a supervisor every two weeks.

Yale has a lot of old and new libraries. They are all great places to study. Free Wifi on campus. Gym is also free for students. Cafeterias are around the campus and the city of New Haven.

Students can contact professors that they are interested in. Usually professors love to have regular meetings with Fox Fellows throughout their exchange. We could also seek help from administrative staffs.

■宿泊先の種類/Type of accommodation:

Students' dormitory

■宿泊先の様子、どのように見つけたか/Environment around the accommodation and how did you find it:

The Fox Fellowship housing is near campus. Typically, it is a house with 2–3 floors, and every floor is an apartment. In every apartment, there are 2–3 bedrooms with a living room, a kitchen, and a toilet. Every fellow will have a bedroom, and shareother facilities with other fellows. Internet, water, and gas are free. Generally speaking, the housing is quite good, especially considering the fact that the rent is covered by the fellowship.

■気候、大学周辺の様子、交通機関、食事等/Climate, environment around the institution, transportation, food, etc.:

New Haven is cold in winter, so prepare enough clothes. The city is not very large, so it is not so easy to find all kinds of foods, especially Asian foods. Yale has free shuttle buses, so transportation is easy.

■お金の管理方法、現地の通貨事情/Management of money and situation about local economy :

The university helped us make a reservation for opening a bank account. After that, we received our fellowship weekly through the bank card. Thus, everything went smoothly.

■治安、医療関係事情、心身の健康管理で気をつけたこと等、危機管理/Aspects of risk and safety management, local health care system, and any actions taken to maintain your health:

The crime rate in New Haven is significantly higher than Japan. So it is important to keep an eye on your safety. Yale Health provides health service to students almost for free. Make the best use of it!

■留学先への入学手続き/Procedures for enrollment required by the host institution:

The application for the Fox Fellowship was very competitive. We needed to explain our passion for our research topic and how our research will contribute to the international community. Recommendation letters from professors were also necessary. It is very imporant to plan your application early.

■ビザの手続き/Procedures to obtain visas:

Fox Fellows was asked to apply for a J1 exchange student visa. It is recommended that you start visa application two months before departure, as the processing time varies case by case.

■医療関係の準備/Preparations or actions taken to maintain your health:

Though I did not pay much attention for maintaining health, it is important to take enough medicine with you to prevent emergency.

■保険関係の準備/Preparations/procedures for insurance:

Following the university's instructions and we could get our insurance. Though it was a little complicated and expansive, insurance is necessary.

■東京大学の所属学部・研究科(教育部)での手続き/Procedures required by faculties or graduate schools at UTokyo:

I needed to apply for a travel permit before leaving.

We needed to have a TOEFL score for application. Generally, it is better for the score to be higher than 100.
