I am inclined to become a basic science researcher in the field of medicine, and the research environment in the U.S. is the most desirable for that purpose. I wanted to gain the research experience there. Also, I was curious how hard students in American colleges study since I heard U.S. colleges are more intense than Japan. I wanted to immerse myself in the environment and see how successful and competitive I could be in it.

■留学中の学習・研究の概要/Overview of the study/research during study abroad:

It depends on what courses you take. If you take an intro course, then you will likely take the course with many students, but if you take higher level courses, class size becomes much smaller sometimes only 3-4 students. Most courses require students to prepare for the classes beforehand. 100-200 page reading is a common assignment for humanity courses. In STEM courses, the assignment is often in the form of homework, which takes 5-10 hours a week per class.

I joined Japanese club called Kizuna, where students who have their background in Japan and are interested in Japanese culture gather at every Friday dinner. We sometimes meet for having curry or sushi party. Additionally, I enjoyed playing basketball in my free time just for fun. I also went to Shogi club as well, which meets every Thursday afternoon.

■週末や長期休暇の過ごし方/How did you spend the weekends and vacations?:

In the fall semester, I spent my weekend mostly grinding in my school work. In the spring semester, I learned how to balance out my homework and leisure time, which allows me to take several trips to places like New York, Baltimore, and DC.

派遣先大学の環境について/About environment at the host institution

■設備/Facilities:

There are three libraries- McCabe, Cornell, and Underhill. Among them, McCabe is the biggest library that consists of three levels with the basement. Students can chat or bring food in the libraries, which was very surprising to me at first. Besideslibraries, you can study in empty classrooms and small study-rooms in other buildings. There is a gym, pool and several fields for athletic clubs. You can use all of them for free when they are open. On campus, there are one big cafeterias and three small cafes where you can get food and drinks. Wi-Fi is so robust, far more stable than the one at UTokyo.

■サポート体制/Support for students:

I do not think there is any support that is specifically for English, but students can drop by professors' office during their office hours to discuss any concerns about it. Also, each student has one academic advisor who they can ask for any help whenever it is necessary. You can also use a couple of students' leading supports such as Student Academic Mentors (SAM) and writing center. The International Student Center is another great resource you can access. The people there are fantastic.

■宿泊先の種類/Type of accommodation:

Students' dormitory

■宿泊先の様子、どのように見つけたか/Environment around the accommodation and how did you find it:

My dorm was on campus. Another student who came from the UTokyo also got in the same dorm. There are more than 10 on campus dorms at Swarthmore, and you will be assigned to one of them. Most of them are withing 10 minute-walk from classroom buildingsand the food hall. You are highly likely to get one or more roommates. The temperature is controlled by central heating system and be prepared for no AC in some dorms.

■気候、大学周辺の様子、交通機関、食事等/Climate, environment around the institution, transportation, food, etc.:

Climate is definitely colder than in Tokyo. Temperature goes down to 20-30 °F in winter. As for transportation, there is a local train called SEPTA, with which you can go to the center city of Philly and the airport. One thing I would complain about the train system is that it runs only every an hour. SEPTA buses also run, but not punctual. Along with the cafeteria and cafes, there are a couple of meal options outside the campus. We call the area Swarthmore Ville. Get food in restaurants there and COOP. Many people prefer going to China town in Philly to get dinner over the weekends.

■お金の管理方法、現地の通貨事情/Management of money and situation about local economy:

You can open a U.S. bank account, but no bank is within walking distance. I used multiple ways to transfer money from Japan. Sometimes I transferred money online from Japanese bank account. Sometimes I used Japanese credit card/ debit card. In addition, you can make a U.S. credit card once you get your Social Security Number, if you want.

■治安、医療関係事情、心身の健康管理で気をつけたこと等、危機管理/Aspects of risk and safety management, local health care system, and any actions taken to maintain your health:

Swarthmore is one of the safest areas in the U.S. You can walk alone freely even during midnight on campus. I sometimes left my belongings for hours in the library or classroom, but I have never had anything stolen. However, to be fair, I heard manyincidences of earphones being stolen on campus. It would be better to be precarious. Nevertheless, overall, the campus is a pretty safe place. In contrast, Philly, which is 30 minute away from Swarthmore, is thought of as one of the least safe cities. When you just hang out with friends, say in China town, I do not think you will encounter very dangerous situations, but you will certainly see some people going crazy on the street due to drug addictions. (One note that would be relevant is the encampment that took place on campus. I was studying abroad when protesting for Palestinians was accelerated. Many students brought their tents on campus, protesting against Swarthmore's investing in war-supporting companies. There were small conflictsbecause of it, while Swarthmore's protest was not that big compared to other universities like Columbia. I am not sure whether this will continue.)

■留学先への入学手続き/Procedures for enrollment required by the host institution:

Enrollment was pretty straightforward, but make sure that you frequently check your new Swarthmore email. You will get many emails once you get your email address. Sometimes due date comes so shortly.

■ビザの手続き/Procedures to obtain visas:

Type of visa: J1I followed the procedure that Swarthmore International Office emailed me.I sent back to the email with the following documents to the international office at Swarthmore to get DS-2019. - Copy of your passport - Proof of health insurance - Certification of Finances and supporting documentation to demonstrate ability to paySubsequently, I got DS-160 online then finally obtained U.S. visa from the U.S. embassy.

■医療関係の準備/Preparations or actions taken to maintain your health:

I brought some medicines. Luckily, I did not develop any serious illnesses during the time at Swarthmore. It was several times, especially the season between Fall and Winter, when many students got COVID and flu. You can get a flu shot on campus (maybe you will be charged)

■保険関係の準備/Preparations/procedures for insurance:

Just purchased the one UTokyo designated. Ask Swarthmore international office whether the insurance meets their requirement.

Since I cannot transfer any credit, there is little that my department asked me to do.
