Program contents/outline	<p>This is a 3 week, 60 hour General English program that aims to improve students English ability and confidence, as well as developing intercultural skills. Students will also have the opportunity to visit University of Adelaide lectures in order to experience campus life in an Australian University (Lectures are optional and students have a choice to attend the arranged lectures or not, however there will only be a set number of lectures that they can attend, so choices will be limited to those that are appropriate/possible to attend).</p> <p>University of Tokyo students will stay with an Australian family in order to undertake an authentic cultural experience. Three meals and airport pick-up &amp; drop off is included. Three activities are included, which will give University of Tokyo students the opportunity to explore Adelaide and interact with local University of Adelaide student guides. Accommodation in detail	<p>Homestay accommodation: staying with an Australian family in a private room within 60 minutes of the CBD. Includes three meals a day and airport pick-up and drop-off.</p> <p>There is generally one student per homestay family. However, due to the current high demand for the homestay program, two students may be placed together in order to ensure that all students have a place to stay. Even in such cases, arrangements will be made so that the other student will not be Japanese whenever possible.</p>

# WHAT'S INCLUDED?

## General English Program

This program aims to develop the communication, language and learning skills needed to operate on personal and social levels within an Australian context. Within this context, a range of learning goals can be accommodated. Some students may intend to go on to do academic study but need to increase their current level of English proficiency; others want to increase their confidence in using English to communicate both professionally and personally in a real-world context: these goals can all be serviced through this introductory program.

The objectives of the program are to assist students to:

- Develop their understanding of the structure and function of the English language
- Develop their ability to use spoken English in order to meet their day to day needs in Australia or an English language context more broadly
- Gain confidence in applying their knowledge and skills actively inside and outside of the classroom
- Present their ideas in written styles appropriate to their level
- Experience the benefits of working cooperatively with others
- Learn about aspects of Australian/Western society and education

## Intercultural Skills

Whilst language skills are invaluable when negotiating and building relationships, the importance of cultural understanding is often overlooked. In order to achieve success, the ability to navigate different cultures, and adapt when necessary, is essential. This program will include modules on intercultural skills, helping students to build an understanding of common social and professional expectations in the multicultural environment

## Lecture Audit

University of Tokyo students will also have the opportunity to attend lectures on the University of Adelaide campus (lecture content subject to availability). This will give students into both the academic content, but also give the opportunity to compare the difference in academic culture.



# WHAT'S INCLUDED?

## Services

From the moment participants arrive, the University of Adelaide has a range of high quality support services designed to help them settle in quickly and succeed in their studies.

Participants will be provided with a comprehensive orientation program on their first day in the ELC including a tour of the University of Adelaide campus and also the city of Adelaide.

Whilst studying in the ELC, participants will have access to health, counselling and other support services from professional University staff.

## Assessment and Graduation

Students will receive an assessment and grade report upon completion of their program. Certificates will be presented at a graduation ceremony and dinner in the last week of the program.

## Accommodation

The students will be placed in homestay accommodation. Students will be placed with an Australian family for a firsthand experience of Australian family life. Homestay is a wonderful way for students to improve their English, gain confidence, learn more about Australian culture and meet new people in a friendly, nurturing environment. The ELC have carefully chosen the host families and many of our families have hosted international students for us for several years. We have a full-time dedicated Homestay Coordinator who provides on-going support to students and host families.

The homestay experience is one of the highlights of a student's time in Adelaide. Students will be greeted at the airport by their homestay family and also taken to the airport when it is time to return to Japan. Breakfast, a packed lunch and dinner is provided by the host family.

# ACTIVITIES

Cultural activities help participants gain a deeper insight into Australian culture, develop team building and are, of course, a fun and enjoyable part of the program. This program includes the following activities:

## Cleland Wildlife Park



Participants will visit Cleland National Park where they can feed kangaroos, wander wetlands, hold a koala, and surround themselves with over 130 species of Australian wildlife. Located in a beautiful natural bush land setting, Cleland offers visitor's many memorable opportunities to discover a large number of South Australia's captivating wildlife. Many animals are free-roaming in the 35-hectare park, creating wonderful impromptu opportunities to touch and interact with our native wildlife.

University of Adelaide students will accompany the group as guides and companions.

## Cafe Culture

With a strong coffee culture and our laidback lifestyle, Adelaide's full of spots to find a lovely brew. Being blessed with a warm Mediterranean climate makes Adelaide the perfect city for al fresco dining and an outside sip. Students will be accompanied by local University of Adelaide students on an exploration of their favourite coffee spots. This is a great opportunity to discover Adelaide and to interact with other young people from the University of Adelaide.

## Beach Day

Adelaide is blessed with a number of world class beaches in close proximity to the centre of the city. The University of Tokyo students will be accompanied by University of Adelaide student guides to enjoy an afternoon at Glenelg beach, catching the local tram to see the sea, eat an ice cream and enjoy the atmosphere.
