Before starting university, I was interested in doing a year abroad. I seriously considered it during my second and third years but became overly concerned about potential downsides, like delaying my graduation or disrupting my scholarship. Because of this, I eventually let go of the idea. By the time I reached my fourth year, I was still unsure whether to pursue a graduate degree in Japan or abroad. I realized that to truly challenge myself and see where I stand, I needed the experience of studying overseas for a year, so I decided to apply.

Each subject includes both a lecture and a tutorial. All lectures are recorded and can be reviewed at any time. Grades are typically determined by a combination of assignments, small quizzes, a midterm exam (essay), and a final exam (essay).

I strongly recommend getting involved in university research experiments. It's a great chance to experience cutting-edge research in different fields, and sometimes, you can even earn a stipend. You can find information about these opportunities on My Unimelb under "All notices" or on posters around campus.

Movies, reading, hiking, or just taking some time to rest.

■設備/Facilities:

The campus is fully equipped with Wi-Fi, and there are several libraries and restaurants on site. The gym is also clean and offers free group classes.

■サポート体制/Support for students:

For English practice, there are plenty of free classes where you can improve your speaking skills, learn how to write better, and more. I also recommend joining activities like Melbourne Talk. Tutorials are really helpful for studying and solving anyissues you might have, and there's also academic support services (though I've found them to be quite busy). For mental health, free counseling is available. Moreover, in terms of daily life, there are services like the free airport pick-up service "Arrival Services" and the "Food Relief Program", where you can get free frozen meals, fresh vegetables, and fruits. It's a good idea to regularly check the UMSU or UMSU International Instagram accounts for updates.

Rented apartments, etc.

■宿泊先の様子、どのように見つけたか/Environment around the accommodation and how did you find it:

The dorms near UniMelb are usually quite expensive, so I decided to go with a shared apartment instead. I found listings and connected with people on social media (like Facebook and RED), and eventually signed

a lease. Since many leases are transfersrather than new contracts, landlords often prioritize those who can move in quickly. So, if you're planning to stay in an apartment, it's better to start looking about a month and a half before your move—in date, rather than six or three months ahead. Just keep in mind that it might be a bit harder to make friends if you choose to live in an apartment.

■気候、大学周辺の様子、交通機関、食事等/Climate, environment around the institution, transportation, food, etc.:

The weather is quite unpredictable, often shifting through all four seasons in a single day. While spring and summer are generally pleasant, autumn and winter can feel much colder due to strong winds and occasional rain. The university's central location is very convenient, with easy access to buses and trains. The surrounding area boasts attractive spots like Royal Park, Carlton Gardens, Fitzroy, and Collingwood, which are great for walking and exploring. Although dining out can be costly, groceries are reasonably priced, so I tend to cook most of my meals at home.

■お金の管理方法、現地の通貨事情/Management of money and situation about local economy:

I opened an account with Commonwealth Bank, which has no fees for setting up the account or for internal transfers between accounts. Since you'll frequently need to transfer money, like when dining out with friends, I recommend setting up your account as soon as you arrive.

■治安、医療関係事情、心身の健康管理で気をつけたこと等、危機管理/Aspects of risk and safety management, local health care system, and any actions taken to maintain your health:

The safety is hard to compare to Japan, but overall, it's relatively good. Guns are regulated, and there are strict controls on alcohol. You might occasionally see homeless individuals or people dealing with drug addiction, but if you encounter someone acting aggressively, it's best to leave the area promptly.

■留学先への入学手続き/Procedures for enrollment required by the host institution:

If you follow the steps on the university's website and the staff's instructions, everything should go smoothly. Since the paperwork can take some time, it's best to get started early. Many courses require prior approval, so it's a good idea to applyfor all the courses you're interested in ahead of time to avoid problems later. If a course is initially denied, you can email the professor explaining why you want to take it and ask for permission directly.

■ビザの手続き/Procedures to obtain visas:

I applied for a student visa online. As a Chinese national, I need to have a medical examination at a designated hospital at my own expense (around ¥30,000) after submitting the visa application. It's a good idea to start the process at least a monthin advance to make sure you have enough time to complete everything.

I had my teeth checked and purchased contact lenses.

You might feel that having overlapping coverage is a bit wasteful, but it's necessary to enroll in all three insurance plans for your visa application: BUPA Health Insurance, Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC), and 学研災付帯海外留学保険(付帯海学).

I'm really pleased with my decision to step out of my comfort zone and live in a completely different environment. It was a valuable opportunity to test myself and see how I perform in a fully English—speaking environment. This experience helped me understand myself better and gave me confidence in my ability to adapt. However, I'm a bit disappointed that I didn't make as many local friends as I had hoped, so I don't feel like I got to fully immerse myself in Australian culture. There's still alot I wish I had experienced and learned in that regard.

It has confirmed my desire to continuously challenge to work and live in another country. However, before making that move, I plan to use Japan as a stepping stone in my career.

It helped me better understand the option of attending law school overseas and, more importantly, gave me a clearer sense of my strengths and weaknesses. My goal of becoming a lawyer who connects countries remains unchanged, and this experience has strengthened my ambition.

GP is the most common solution when you need to see a doctor. So research the GP clinic that is covered by your insurance and speak the language you are comfortable with. If it is not a big problem, the pharmacy can deal with it well most of the time.

The main thing is to maintain contact with and check emails from the Global Learning office in UniMelb. There is an application process, and you just need to follow the instructions on the system. It is overall very smooth.

I applied to Australian visa online. You need to follow the procedure provided by the host university after they provide you with COE.

Make sure to take medication that you have been using long-term, and take prescription beforehand with your doctor. In general, medicines in Australia is good for common illness like stomachache and cold.

My accommodation was very close to the campus. I had a private room but the kitchen and bathrooms were shared across each floor. I found my accommodation through online searches and google maps.

■気候、大学周辺の様子、交通機関、食事等/Climate, environment around the institution, transportation, food, etc.:

I stayed from Feb-June, and in February it was quite hot, but during winter time it was much colder, around 8-10 degrees C. Transport was relatively convenient with the trams and Melbourne is also very walkable. It can be quite expensive to eat out all the time, so definitely buy ingredients and cook if you are on a budget.

Opening a local bank account through Commbank was really simple and convenient, and I found it really easy to use a debit card / my phone to pay for things. I used Wise to transfer money out of Japan.

Don't provoke anyone on the streets and keep hydrated. Put on sunscreen.

I submitted the usual documents: proof of English proficiency, passport, etc. If you want to register for some higher level courses you need to submit some proof that you match the entry requirements, so prepare the syllabus outline of the appropriate UTokyo courses so that you can take the courses that you want

I applied for a student visa online through the immigration website, and it took around 1.5 weeks to receive the visa after I submitted the application. The application site asks for your travel history, so have that ready when you apply.

I took my own first aid kit with my usual medications for common cold / flu symptoms.

I got the mandatory insurance from UTokyo and University of Melbourne.
