Components

- 1. Prepared Speech 70 points
- 2. Question-and-Answer Session 10 points
- 3. Impromptu Speech 20 points

Prepared Speech 4 minutes

- Develop and deliver a 4 minute speech based on the following topic: "Creating a diverse future together"
- Speeches must be at least 3 minutes long and shall not exceed 4 minutes.
- Speeches must be memorized, reading from a script or prompt will result in disqualification
- Contestants who plan to use props must notify Organizer prior to 10
 August 2025; all props must be set up during the minute of silence
 prior to the Contest Speech and removed from the stage in the minute
 of silence following. Please note, that judges may add or subtract
 marks according to the manner in which props are used.

Question-and-Answer Session 1 minute

- One question will be asked after the contestant completes his/her Prepared Speech
- Questions will be related to the contestant's prepared speech
- Contestants will receive no advance knowledge of the question
- Answers must be at least 30 seconds long and shall not exceed 1 minute

• Impromptu Speech 2 minutes

- Impromptu speeches must be at least 1 minute 30 seconds long and shall not exceed 2 minutes
- Questions will be of a general nature and not require a detailed knowledge
- Contestants will receive no advance knowledge of the topic until the contest
- Contestants may not use digital devices during the Impromptu Speech section

Documents Required

To Register

• Upon nomination, contestants must provide a valid travel document for



accommodation arrangements.

• A recent photo of the contestant and the university logo are required for promotional materials.

After Registration

• A copy of the speech must be submitted to the MPSA's Question Master at macauprospeaking@gmail.com from 25 to 30 July 2025. Please save the file in PDF format and the maximum file size is 15MB per file. Once submitted, speeches are final unless changes are approved by the Organizing Committee.

Contestant Responsibility:

To maintain the integrity of the event and ensure effective logistics management, withdrawals after confirmation are not permitted. Contestants are required to purchase their own flight tickets (economy class) and present their boarding passes and receipts in person to the Implementing Partner in Macau for reimbursement. The maximum reimbursement amounts are USD 3,000 for countries/regions in Europe, North America, and Oceania, and USD 750 for countries/regions in Asia.

Originality

• Contestants must create their own speeches, and each must be substantially original. Reusing speeches that have been performed in other events and competitions are forbidden. Plagiarism is strictly forbidden.

Important Notes

- Twenty-five percent or less of the speech may be devoted to quoting, paraphrasing, or referencing another person's content. Any quoted, paraphrased, or referenced content must be so identified during the speech presentation.
- The topics chosen by the individual contestant do not necessarily reflect the views or opinions of the Organizer.
- Speech scripts cannot be altered after submission without approval from the Organizing Committee.

Timing Rules

- Timing begins with their first verbal or non-verbal communication with the audience
- Contestants must stay within the designated time limits for their speeches.



Failure to do so may lead to disqualification or a deduction of marks.

- **Prepared Speech:** A green signal will be given when the minimum time requirement is reached (3 minutes). An amber signal will be given at 3 minutes 30 seconds. A bell will ring when the time is up and the contestant must finish their speech within 15 seconds.
- Question-and-Answer Session: A green signal will be given when the minimum time requirement is reached (30 seconds). A bell will ring when the time is up and the contestant must finish their speech within 15 seconds.
- Impromptu Speech: A green signal will be given when the minimum time requirement is reached (1 minute 30 seconds). A bell will ring when the time is up and the contestant must finish their speech within 15 seconds.

A summary of the timing signals is listed below:

Registration Notes

- All contestants must arrive and register before the deadline.
- By registering, contestants agree to comply with all regulations and arrangements of the championship. The Organizer reserves the right to amend the competition rules, make other arrangements, and not to present some of the awards without giving prior notice.

Personal Data Collection Statement

University of Macau will collect and handle applicants' personal data (either hard copy or electronic format) for the purposes of registration and statistical analysis. The data of photos, recordings and videos that are collected in this Championship will be for the purposes of education and publicity. These data, once collected, may be shared with other units within UM for transfer, processing and other utilization. Data may also be shared with government departments and judicial authorities in accordance with prevailing legal provisions. In accordance with the prevailing 'Personal Data Protection Act' in Macao, applicants are entitled to access and amend their personal data. Please



submit a signed request in order to exercise these aforementioned rights.
