	Language Requirements
University-Wide Agreements Exchange students whose first language is not English must prove their English proficiency through one of following options:	Nordlys, CIVIS, and north2north programs Exchange students in these programs do not need to submit an English Language certificate unless specifically requested.
 English Certificate Letter from home university equal to below. IELTS: 6.0 overall with at least 5.5 in each of the four components. 	Swedish taught courses Students who want to take classes taught in Swedish might need to hand in a language certificate. This will be decided by the respective department.
 TOEFL: PBT 550 or iBT 79. Please note that we do not accept TOEFL iBT MyBest. Test results should not be more than two years old. 	

Nomination and Application Procedure & Admission

Nominations

Partner universities submit nominations through our portal. Relevant information and instructions are provided to them before the nomination deadline. Nomination Deadlines for Partners (New Update):

- o Autumn semester: 1 April
- o Spring semester: 20 September

Application and Course Selection

Nominated students receive application instructions and are need to carefully review the Fact *Sheet, Guide for Application, and Course Selection* before completing their application. Applications must be submitted by the deadline.

Application Deadlines for Students

- Autumn semester: 15 April (New Update)
- Spring semester: 1 October

Admission

Admitted exchange students receive a Letter of Acceptance upon successful admission. They will also receive a welcome letter with all essential details about their exchange program.

Housing

Admitted exchange students receive housing application instructions via email after admission and must apply for accommodation by the deadline to secure a chance of getting a housing offer. Failure to comply with the instructions and deadline will impact the chance of receiving an accommodation offer.

Admission to Courses

Exchange students will receive confirmation of admission to the courses directly from the department no later than August/December. If a course is rejected, students will be contacted by our International Office to select alternatives. Please note that admission to the exchange program does not guarantee enrollment in specific courses. Departments may have additional eligibility criteria.

Visa Information

Exchange students with citizenship in countries outside EU/EEA and Switzerland need to apply for a residence permit for studies in Sweden. This applies even if you currently hold a residence permit for studies in another EU country. You may use the Letter of Acceptance to apply for a residence permit for studies through the Swedish Migration Agency. Note that the assessment times at the Migrations Agency are lengthy and that students need to apply for a residence permit for studies as soon as possible after receiving Letter of Acceptence (at least 4 months in advance). In addition, students need to make an appointment to show their passport at an embassy as soon as it is possible after they received their residence permit application. Course Registration and Learning Agreement

The departments register exchange students to courses and provide final information in courses before the course start. Learning Agreements can only be signed after final course admission by the department.

Arrival to Stockholm University

Exchange students are warmly welcomed to Stockholm University. We organize an Arrival Day and offer Welcome Activities designed to help them settle in and connect with fellow students. For additional details, can be found here.

Departure from Stockholm University

Exchange student will be offered information upon departure and be invited to a farewell activity. Digital transcripts with a verification link are offered to exchange students once grades are finalized. Students will receive instructions at the end of the semester. 	cover home insurance and must be arranged, separatly by the exchange students.
