At SOAS, you will be part of a diverse community of students making a positive impact on a fast-changing world.

Our Students' Union (SU) is known as one of the most active in the UK: whether you are interested in music, film & culture clubs, sports or leading campaigns for social change, you will be able to join a society of like-minded students and participate in countless events organised by the University and the SU.

SOAS houses a National Research Library, a world-renowned resource containing over 1.5 million items in more than 400 languages: it is the largest East Asian library collection of Europe. As a SOAS student, you will also have access to University of London libraries (LSE, UCL, Senate House).

The Study Abroad team organises monthly events, such as scavenger hunts, karaoke & bowling nights, museum visits and runs a Buddy Programme which matches incoming students with SOAS students returning from their Year Abroad.

We also assist students with finding accommodation, with most of our Study Abroad students living in Dinwiddy House, a 20 minute walk from campus.

Study Abroad and Exchange students at SOAS are welcome to use all our services and facilities, including Student Advice and Wellbeing and the Careers Service. We have specialist support for international students including free Academic English classes, and have a dedicated Disability Office to make sure our students' different needs are met.

We will consider late applications on a case by case basis. Students should be aware that applying late will lower their chances of getting accommodation.

Academic Requirements

USA GPA of 3.3 or equivalent. We can consider applications with a 3.0 GPA on a case by case basis, provided that a strong academic reference letter is included.

English Language Requirements

English test	Overall score	Subscores
IELTS	6.0	5.5 in all subscores
Students with lower language scores may be offered a conditional offer at SOAS with the opportunity to take a pre-session English course to increase their language ability to the required grade.
