- Penryn Campus, near Falmouth, Cornwall

Students cannot study modules at both Devon and Cornwall campuses.



Nomination

Nomination Deadlines:

30th April (Semester 1) | 1st October (Semester 2)

The home university should nominate their students using our online form, which will be emailed one month before the nomination deadline. If you are a Direct Enrol applicant please contact inbound@exeter.ac.uk directly.

Application

Application Deadlines:

31st May (Semester 1) | 31st October (Semester 2)

Students must complete an online application, with copies of the following documents:

- Official Academic Transcript from the home university (English translation if applicable).
- Copy of their passport ID page.
- Evidence of English language level, where applicable. For more details check our website.
- Academic Reference (for Direct Enrol students only)

Applications submitted without ALL supporting documents will not be processed.



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Semester One Dates

Suggested Arrival: 13- 15 September 2025

Welcome Week: 15 - 20 September 2025

Classes: 22 September - 12 December 2025

Examinations: 5 - 10 January 2026



Semester Two Dates

Suggested Arrival: 10 - 11 January 2026

Orientation: 12 January 2026*

Classes: 12 January - 26 March 2026

Examinations: 27 April - 1 June 2026

*Pre-Orientation available to early arrivals on 9 January 2025

Modules

Students are expected to study **60 Exeter credits per semester (30 ECTS)**, students are able to take 45 credits with written permission from their home university. European exchange students must choose 75% of their modules from the department we have the agreement with their home university. Other students should take 50% of their modules within one subject area.

Course Restrictions

- Psychology courses are only available for Psychology-specific exchange partners.
- Biomedical Science courses are only available for Biomedical Sciences-specific exchange partners.
- Graduate School of Education, Liberal Arts modules (LIB) and Degree Apprenticeship modules are not available.

Where possible modules will be allocated pre-arrival, but will need to be finalised upon arrival and registration. There is a module change period during the first two weeks of each semester.

Transcripts

Semester 1 transcripts are sent out in March. Full Year and Semester 2 transcripts are sent out in July. A digital version will be sent directly to the home university and student.

Finances

Exchange students will have their tuition fee waived. Direct Enrol students can find information on tuition fees on the Inbound website. Living expenses vary depending on lifestyle choices. As a guide, students should budget around £1026 a month to cover expenses.



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Accommodation

Full Year Students

Students are guaranteed University owned or managed student housing if they apply by 31st July.

Single Semester Students

Students are not guaranteed University housing, there are a limited number of rooms available. We recommend that they also research private housing. Immigration

Students who are not British or Irish nationals must enter the UK with the appropriate [immigration permission](#). Students should research which is best for their situation before submitting an application:

- Visitor immigration permission (for single semester students)
- Student Visa (for full year students)
