
The Campus

Summer School students study on Warwick's extraordinary self-contained campus, with access to all of its amazing facilities. We have flexible teaching and learning spaces, a 24-hour library, Arts Centre and cinema, as well as a Sports and Wellness Hub with swimming pool. Across the campus, you'll find restaurants and cafes, and many green spaces including lakes, woodland, and open fields. The campus is set in nearly 300 hectares of natural countryside, where you can relax and escape from the buzz of main campus.

Location

The University of Warwick is in the heart of England, ideally located on the border of the West Midlands and Warwickshire. It has all the advantages of easy access to the major cities of Coventry (just three miles to the South West), Birmingham and central London but with the peace of a beautiful self-contained and green campus. We are right in the centre of England, easy to reach by rail, car or plane from all parts of the UK and abroad.

The closest airport is Birmingham International which is just a 20 minute journey away. Your Summer School experience includes an airport pick up and drop off from Birmingham Airport.



English for Global Communication Programme

The English for Global Communication programme will give you a broad range of experiences inclass, and more widely in the University and the cultural trips within the UK. The course of study is designed to be engaging and interactive, giving you maximum opportunities to develop your English language skills and knowledge.

The course is designed to help you learn and practice your English language and intercultural skills and knowledge. You will learn about living and studying in the UK, an experience which we hope you will find enjoyable and rewarding.

Programme Outcomes

By the end of the programme students will have:

- Researched and prepared a poster on an intercultural topic
- Presented at a poster presentation event
- Researched and contributed to a multi-modal "Visit UK" research project
- Contributed to a multi-modal presentation

There are a number of strands delivered as part of the programme:

Communication and Study Skills

In these sessions you will study and practice your English language skills for both general and academic English. The lessons will be focused on Listening and Speaking, and Reading and Writing Skills.

Intercultural Communication

These lesson will equip you with the knowledge, skills, and awareness necessary to navigate and engage effectively in a cross-cultural environment. The sessions are designed to foster intercultural competence, enabling participants to understand, appreciate, and adapt to cultural differences in communication styles, social norms, and everyday interactions.

Lecture Programme

The lecture programme has twin aims of developing lecture and seminar skills, as well as giving lectures on aspects British life, culture, and history.

Cultural Trip Preparation

Before each cultural trip you will study an integrated skills lessons, which will give you background information and help you to plan and get the most from your trip.

Projects

You will work in groups to explore and research aspects of British culture, making comparison and reflecting on differences with your own home culture. There are two projects.

- 1. Poster presentation.
- 2. Multi-modal presentation.

Half day trips

City of Birmingham - Birmingham is the second largest city in the UK. Home to the Bullring and Grand Central Station (a paradise for shopping), museums, galleries, botanical gardens, canals, theatres and a thriving restaurant scene. For chocolate lovers is nearby Cadbury's World.

London - London is packed with world-famous attractions such as Trafalgar Square, Houses of Parliament, Buckingham Palace, theatres and many excellent and free museums.












Accommodation
