### 1. Purpose and Content

Please refer to “1. Outline” of the General Application Guidelines.

### 2. Course Period

The visit to Seoul, Korea will take place from Tuesday, August 26 to Friday, August 29. However, participation in all of the activities listed in “4. Overall Schedule (tentative)” is mandatory.

### 3. Number of Students (Maximum enrollment number)

Total 10 undergraduate and graduate students  
(10 students from Korea will participate. Five teams of two students from each country (Japan and Korea) will be formed to review, discuss, and present the program theme.)

### 4. Overall schedule (Tentative)

Noon on Friday, July 18	Internal application deadline
Around July 25	Internal selection and the announcement of result
Monday, August 4 (3 hours between 6:00 pm and 9:00 pm)	Kick-off orientation and lecture (Online)
Tuesday, August 26 – Friday, August 29	Visit to Seoul (4 days/3 nights) (Site visit, on-site lectures, student team discussions, preparation of presentation materials, mentoring, visits to related companies, etc. are planned.)
September – Early November	Lecture and student-led online preparatory meetings are planned.
Early October – Late October	Each participating student must register for the course during the registration period of their affiliation.
Wednesday, November 19– Sunday, November 23	Participation in and presentation at Tokyo Forum
5:00 pm, Monday, December 1	Deadline for submission of the individual report (TBC. Submission via Google form is planned.)
Mid-February – Mid-March	Grades will be released during the period in which grades are released for each participating student's affiliated faculty or graduate school.

### 5. Eligibility and Requirement

Applicants must possess the motivation and ability to attend lectures, participate in Q&A sessions, and report on the program's results, all of which will primarily be conducted in English. While it is preferable for applicants to submit a certificate of English proficiency, those without such a certificate may still apply.

### 6. Flight for the Visit to Seoul, Korea

Flight tickets will be purchased collectively by the Tokyo Forum Secretariat. The scheduled details are as below. Individual requests for changes by participating students cannot be accommodated. Additionally, we will not be able to respond to individual e-mails or phone calls inquiring about flight details.

- Departure and arrival points in Japan: Haneda Airport or Narita Airport
- Airports in Korea: Gimpo Airport or Incheon Airport

- Flight time: To be determined.

#### 7. Accommodation during the Visit to Seoul and Tokyo Forum event period

During the visit to Seoul, Korea (August 26–29), all UTokyo students enrolled in this course will stay at the same accommodation. During the Tokyo Forum period (November 19–23), both the enrolled students and those participating students from Korea will also stay at the same accommodation.

Please note that shared rooms are expected during both cases. If you have any special considerations regarding room arrangements (e.g., health conditions), please indicate them in your application (11. Special Notes). The administrative office will take them into account as much as possible.

#### 8. Expenses and Scholarships

- **Expenses:** The Tokyo Forum Secretariat will cover the cost of airfare and accommodation for the visit to Seoul from Tuesday, August 26 to Friday, August 29, as well as meals that are included in the program (some of which will be provided at the accommodation). All other expenses are the responsibility of the participating students.
