Program contents/outline	<p>This study program in Bangkok and nearby provinces uses Thailand as a living laboratory for culture, sustainability, and business. Students learn through a mix of workshops, company visits, cultural excursions, and hands-on field activities. The program focuses on cross-cultural understanding, Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), carbon neutrality, sustainable agriculture, coastal conservation, and sustainable business and product design.</p> <p>Over 14 days in Bangkok, Ratchaburi, and nearby heritage sites, students will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> •Immerse themselves in Thai culture with local buddies, language practice, and city heritage tours including the Grand Palace, Wat Arun, Wat Pho and Ayutthaya, a UNESCO World Heritage site. •Explore real-world sustainability at green factories, Lemon Me Farm, O-Poi Market, Bee Park Research Centre, and mangrove restoration sites facing coastal erosion. •Join hands-on workshops on cross-cultural communication, SDGs and carbon neutrality in Thai business, sustainable product design with upcycled leather, and impact-driven business thinking. •Turn ideas into visible prototypes through “Thailand as a Living Lab,” design and mentor clinics, and present their final projects at a closing ceremony. <p>Designed as a study-abroad style experience, this program builds global mindset, cultural intelligence, and practical sustainability skills while letting students enjoy Thailand’s rich history, local markets, and time for self-exploration.</p> <p style="color: red;">本学学生が集団で参加するプログラムで、参加学生は主に本学学生及び他大学の日本人学生となります。</p>
