1. Application guidelines for the program scholarship

Please carefully review this document. In order to apply for the scholarships, students are required to complete the following Scholarship Application Survey form. If you do not respond to the form by the deadline, you will be considered as a non-scholarship applicant.

2. Guidelines for the awarding of the program-affiliated scholarship

Students who participate in this program, if they wish to receive a scholarship, will be awarded a scholarship (non-repayment type) subject to the following requirements.

(1) Types of scholarships

The types of scholarships are either ①JASSO (Japan Student Services Organization) 2026 Student Exchange Support Program (Scholarship for Exchange Programs) (hereinafter referred to as the “JASSO Exchange Scholarship”), ②scholarships funded by donations from foundations, individuals or ③scholarships from the University of Tokyo.

(2) Eligibility Requirements, Support Details and Criteria/Method of Disbursement

As a general rule, all scholarships are provided in accordance with the eligibility requirements, support details and criteria/method of disbursement set by JASSO for the JASSO Exchange Scholarship. (For the monthly scholarship amount, please refer to “Monthly Value by Regions”). However, for scholarships other than the JASSO Exchange Scholarship, travel support grant will not be provided.

(3) Travel Support Grant (Based on Household Income Criteria)

If an applicant can provide documentation proving that they meet certain household income criteria, an additional “Travel Support Grant (Based on Household Income Criteria)” of 160,000 yen may be awarded in addition to the monthly scholarship (only for recipients of the JASSO Exchange Scholarship). Further details will be provided separately to students who indicate their interest in receiving the travel support grant in the “Scholarship Application Survey” and are expected to meet the eligibility requirements.

(4) Applicants without Japanese Permanent Residency

If an applicant does not hold Japanese permanent residency but meets all other requirements listed under “3. Eligibility and requirements for the JASSO Exchange Scholarship,” except for (1), a separate scholarship may be awarded under the same conditions as the JASSO Exchange Scholarship.

(5) Scholarships Funded by Donations from Foundations or Individuals

Applicants who were not selected for ① the JASSO Exchange Scholarship may be considered for ② scholarships funded by donations from foundations or individuals or ③ scholarships from the University of Tokyo, based on their internal selection ranking and other factors.

(6) Multiple Receipt of Scholarships

If students are awarded scholarships from other organizations which amount to more than the sums provided by the program specific scholarship or are awarded the scholarship “Japan Public-Private Partnership Student Study Abroad Program -TOBITATE! Young Ambassador Program-”, etc., the program specific scholarship shall not be awarded. (Please refer to 3. (7) to check the guidelines of a multiple receipt of scholarships.)

(7) Japanese Government (MEXT) Scholarship Student

This scholarship may be awarded to MEXT Scholarship students as it is provided for specific use such as part of travel expenses. However, it may not be awarded due to specific conditions provided in the rules of MEXT Scholarship. For details, please consult the relevant section of your affiliated school in UTokyo

- (8) If a student discontinues or suspends their study abroad, the student may be required to refund all or part of the scholarship already paid. In such cases, the student must promptly notify the International Education Promotion Group. In addition, if it is found that a scholarship recipient does not meet the eligibility requirements stated in the application guidelines, or is otherwise deemed ineligible as a scholarship recipient, the recipient may also be required to refund all or part of the scholarship already received.

3. Eligibility and requirements for the JASSO Exchange Scholarship

Students must be enrolled in a regular course with the aim of graduating or obtaining a degree, who are approved to participate in an outbound program that has been allocated scholarship funding by the University, and who meet all of the requirements listed in (1) through (10) below.

- (1) They must possess Japanese nationality or have been given right of permanent residence in Japan.
- (2) Students who have been accepted by overseas host universities based on agreements and/or MOU's on student exchange.
- (3) Students who will have financial difficulties affording the study abroad program without financial support.
- (4) Students who are able to obtain the visa required for participating in the program in the country or region of the host institution.
- (5) Students who will return to UTokyo to continue their study, and acquire a degree from UTokyo, or graduate from UTokyo after completing the study abroad programs.
- (6) Students who demonstrate excellent academic performance at UTokyo and possess appropriate personal qualities. In addition, students must have a minimum of 2.30 Grading Coefficient or higher, based on a transcript from the previous academic year at the time of application for the study abroad program.

If the applicant's transcript of the previous academic year is not available, the Grading Coefficient shall, in principle, be calculated based on the applicant's academic record from the previous semester. If the cumulative Grading Coefficient from the time of enrollment, including the previous academic year, is 2.30 or higher, it shall be regarded as equivalent.

If the cumulative Grade Coefficient,

- For undergraduate students in their first semester of the first year, grades will be calculated based on their third-year high school academic records.
- For master's students in their first semester of the first year, grades will be calculated based on academic records from the final year of undergraduate studies at the University of Tokyo or another university.
- For doctoral students in their first semester of the first year, grades will be calculated based on academic records from the final year of master's studies at the University of Tokyo or another university.
- For students who were on a leave of absence for the entire previous academic year, grades will be calculated based on academic performance from two years prior. For students who were on a leave of absence during the latter half of the previous academic year, grades will be calculated based on academic performance from the first half of that year.

----- [An example of calculating method of grading coefficient] (Automatically calculated on UTAS*) -----

* The grading coefficient is determined based on the most up-to-date academic record used at the time of internal selection after submission via UTAS. Accordingly, it may differ from the grades confirmed by students at the time of application..

Convert to grading point by the following table and apply them to the formula (round off to two decimal places).

Grading Coefficient Formula:

$$\frac{([\text{No. of GP3 Credits}] \times 3) + ([\text{No. of GP2 Credits}] \times 2) + ([\text{No. of GP1 Credits}] \times 1) + ([\text{No. of GPO Credits}] \times 0)}{\text{Total Number of Registered Credits}}$$

*No. =Number

*GP=Grade Point

<Note> If you have taken courses that are not part of the credit system, or you are calculating with grades from your final year of high school, replace “Credits” in the Grading Coefficient Formula with “Number of Courses/Subjects”.

(7) Students whose total amount of scholarships (not including travel expenses, etc., or scholarship loan and student loan which require repayment) to attend this study abroad program from other sources (including UTokyo and host institutions, etc.), do not exceed the monthly amounts of this scholarship will be eligible for the scholarship.

Note 1: “Scholarships to attend this study abroad program from other sources” (Other scholarships) means ones which students receive directly. If students have raised funding for their study abroad program, including cloud funding, the said funding is regarded as a part of “other scholarships”. In case that housing fee, program participation fee, etc., which are funded by the home university, etc., are not regarded as a part of “other scholarships”.

Note 2: If other scholarships are not monthly basis, please calculate and confirm the monthly stipend.

Note 3: If other scholarships include travel expenses, including airfare, please exclude the travel expenses and calculate the monthly stipend to confirm that the amount does not exceed the monthly stipend from JASSO scholarships.

Note 4: Income from remunerated training, internships, part-time work, etc. may be combined with the scholarship under this program, regardless of the amount, if the university determines that it will not interfere with the achievement of the program's objectives and goals and the student's academic studies (research).

Note 5: If you are receiving scholarships from other organizations, please make sure with the organization that you are permitted to receive additional scholarships from other sources.

Note 6: Scholarships which students receive regardless of the study abroad program are generally not considered to be “other scholarships” (except for a few). Therefore, it is possible to receive multiple scholarships, but some scholarship organizations may not allow combined awards. It is important to check with the relevant organization and the department in charge of domestic scholarships (* 1) to confirm.

Note 7: In addition to the above, please note that there may be cases in which scholarships received from other organizations, etc. may not be approved in conjunction with the program specific scholarship, depending on the source of funding and nature of the scholarship.

(* 2) 20th of the month prior to that you wish to pause receiving the loan from. (Note: If you belong to the College of Arts and Sciences, please follow the instructions from the Student Support Group of the College of Arts and Sciences.)

(8) Students who will provide sufficient information in report documents specified by UTokyo and submit them by the designated dates, and will cooperate when requested to respond to follow-ups, attend meetings and respond to career surveys, etc. after completing the study abroad programs.

(9) When requested by JASSO, students who will agree for UTokyo to provide their information (name, contact, affiliated faculty, etc.) which is submitted at the internal selection.

(10) Students who will be studying in an area which is not listed on the Overseas Security Website of Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Japan with a warning of “Level 2: Avoid unnecessary visiting” or worse:

*If an area which students will be studying in is listed on the Overseas Security Website of Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Japan with a warning of “Level 2” or worse at the time of registering as a recipient of this scholarship, you are not permitted to register as a recipient of this scholarship. Additionally, if an area which students will be studying in is listed on the Overseas Security Website of Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Japan with a warning of “Level 2” or worse during the program period, the payment of this scholarship will be postponed in principle.
