By signing below, I, _____, (hereinafter referred to as “the Student”) acknowledge and agree that I have read and accepted the terms and conditions below for the purpose of applying to and participating in the program administered by the Center for Global Education, The University of Tokyo (University-wide Student Exchange Program) (hereinafter referred to as “the Program”).

I shall not object to the repatriation order resulting from my violation of the terms and conditions for participating in the Program.

I. GENERAL CONDITIONS

1. The Student has consulted the relevant sections of the faculty, college or graduate school that the Student will belong to at the time of their going abroad, received explanations on the points to be noted concerning their study-abroad, and fully understand them before applying.
2. The Student understands the financial implications of their participation in the program, and applies to the program with the approval of their parent(s)/guardian who will be financially supporting the Student.
3. The Student understands that they will not be allowed to decline their candidacy once accepted as the program participant. Student’s withdrawal from the program will only be permitted under exceptional and unavoidable circumstances which the Center for Global Education duly regards to be valid.
4. The Student shall take full responsibility of their own preparations and arrangements required to participate in the Program (such as preparation and submission of paperwork required by the host institutions, completing the procedures required by their the faculty, college or graduate school of the University of Tokyo, making necessary travel arrangements, including obtaining a passport and visas, payment of costs and fees associated with the participation in the Program, payment of accommodation, purchasing appropriate insurance coverage for the duration of the Program, etc.). Please be aware that if they cannot satisfy the entry and/or language requirements set by the partner university at the time of submitting the application documents to the partner university because they failed to check the requirements thoroughly in advance or obtaining the required scores (even in cases where the partner university only sets language proficiency standards without requiring the submission of language proficiency certification documents, the International Education Promotion group will require the submission of such documents to confirm that they meet the language proficiency standards.), they will not be accepted. PLEASE BE AWARE that the Center for Global Education will not be able to take any actions to help them out.
5. When arranging round-trip flights, the Student shall not reserve or use airline tickets that include layovers or transits (including transit that does not require immigration entry) in countries or regions designated as Level 2: Avoid Non-Essential Travel(レベル2：不要不急の渡航は止めてください) or higher under the

Travel Advice and Warning (危険情報), an Infectious Disease Travel Advice and Warning (感染症危険情報) of Level 4: Evacuate and Avoid All Travel (Evacuation Advisory (レベル4 : 退避してください。渡航は止めてください。(退避勧告))) issued by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Japan. If the travel advisory level for any layover or transit country or region is raised to level 2 or higher after the ticket has been booked, the Student must, at their own responsibility and expense, promptly make the necessary arrangements, including changing to an alternative route.

6. For insurance during the Program, it is mandatory for the Student to purchase JEES “*Futai Kaigaku*” at their own expense, from the day of departure from their home in Japan until the day of returning to their home in Japan (This will not be paid for by the University). Please be aware that the student shall be solely responsible for any financial loss or liability arising from failure to complete the purchase procedures or to purchase insurance covering the required period.

7. As a risk management measure during the program, the Student is required to enroll in the Overseas Student Safety Management Assistance (OSSMA) provided by Emergency Assistance Japan Co., Ltd. for the entire period of the Program (including any personal stay before and after the program period) at their own expense. (This will not be paid for by the University)

8. The Student should commit themselves to their study or research activities in order to achieve the objective of the Program.

9. The Student shall abide the laws, rules and regulations, and codes of conduct set forth by the authority of the host nation as well as the host institution. The Student must strictly abide by the required self-isolation and quarantine measures and must not use any kind of drugs prohibited by the host country and Japan.

10. The Student shall take all precautions to ensure their own safety. The Student should avoid any type of activities that may put them in danger.

11. On completion of the Program, the Student is required to return to Japan and shall resume their study at the University of Tokyo.

12. The Student understands that the personal data including their name, contact details and academic records obtained by their faculty, college or graduate School and the International Education Promotion Group during the application process may be used to contact the Student regarding activities organized by the International Education Promotion Group, such as promoting study abroad programs or providing advice to students interested in studying abroad.

II. CANCELLATION OR POSTPONEMENT OF PROGRAM PARTICIPATION, RETURN HOME, AND SUSPENSION OR REPAYMENT OF SCHOLARSHIP

1. The University of Tokyo may require the Student to cancel, or postpone their participation in the Program, return home, or suspend scholarship payments, or repay all or part of the scholarship already disbursed under any of the following circumstances:

- (1) The Student violates the terms of General Conditions described in Section I above.
- (2) The Student is found to have made false declaration in their application forms.
- (3) The Student fails to comply with the applicable code of conduct during the Program.
- (4) The Student is subject to disciplinary action by the host institution.
- (5) The host institution determines that the Student is unable meet the required academic standards.
- (6) If there is a significant deterioration of security and public health situation in the country where the host institution is located, or in countries/regions used for layovers or transits during a round trip travel (e.g. if the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Japan (MOFA) issues either a Travel Advice and Warning (危険情報) of Level 2: Avoid Non-Essential Travel (レベル 2 : 不要不急の渡航は止めてください) or more, or an

Infectious Disease Travel Advice and Warning (感染症危険情報) of Level 4: Evacuate and Avoid All Travel (Evacuation Advisory (レベル 4 : 退避してください。渡航は止めてください。(退避勧告))), the Student will be instructed to cancel or postpone the study abroad, and return home, even after being selected through the University's internal screening process.

2. The Student shall bear all costs incurred as a result of complying with the University's instructions pursuant to the preceding paragraph, or due to the Student's personal circumstances. This includes costs include but are not limited to those arising from the cancellation or postponement of program participation, an order to return home after departure, or an early return due to the Student's personal circumstances. These may include return travel expenses, costs associated with changes to or rebooking of airline tickets and any related fees or incidental expenses.

III. LIABILITY NOT ATTRIBUTED TO THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE UNIVERSITY OF TOKYO

The Student acknowledges and accepts that the University of Tokyo is not liable for any personal or material damages and that the Student shall not be entitled to any benefit, payment, subsidy, compensation, or entitlement resulting from any such incidents as follows:

- (1) Losses and damages caused by and/or associated with Natural Disaster, Marine Accident, Fire, Ordinance issued by Government or Public Institution, War, Conflict, Riot, Strike Action, Theft, Isolation, Terrorism, Hijacking, Aircraft Accident, Traffic Accident, Crime, Pandemic and/or Epidemic Disease, Custom Restrictions, change of the flight schedule, delays in obtaining a visa, or visa denial, Force Majeure, and any other losses and/or damages caused by unanticipated and uncontrollable forces.
- (2) Losses and damages caused by extracurricular activities (during breaks/free time, on holidays etc.).
- (3) Losses and damages resulting from the Program Participant's act of violation of law and/or public order.
- (4) Any losses and damages caused by the Program Participant's negligence or intentional acts.
- (5) Any losses and damages caused by acts not consistent with the scope of purpose and mission of the Program.
- (6) Any losses and damages derived from the Participant personal problem.
